

My Dear Friends,

Why did Jesus, the Sinless One, submit himself to John's baptism? John preached a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins (Luke 3:3). In this humble submission we see a foreshadowing of the "*baptism*" of his bloody death upon the cross. Jesus' baptism is the acceptance and the beginning of his mission as God's suffering Servant (Isaiah 53). He allowed himself to be numbered among sinners. Jesus submitted himself entirely to his Father's will. Out of love he consented to this baptism of death for the remission of our sins.

The Father proclaimed his entire delight in his Son and spoke audibly for all to hear. The Holy Spirit, too, was present as he anointed Jesus for his ministry which began that day as he rose from the waters of the Jordan river. Jesus will be the source of the Spirit for all who come to believe in him. At his baptism the heavens were opened and the waters were sanctified by the descent of Jesus and the Holy Spirit, signifying the beginning of a new creation.

How can we enter into the mystery of Jesus' humble self-abasement and baptism? Gregory of Nazianzus, a seventh century Church father tells us: "*Let us be buried with Christ by Baptism to rise with him; let us go down with him to be raised with him; and let us rise with him to be glorified with him*"

God bless you, and may Mary our Mother watch over you and protect you always,

The Pope's Corner

Pope Francis to large families: you are a gift to society

Pope Francis said on Sunday that "in a world often marred by selfishness, a large family is a role model for solidarity and sharing and this benefits the whole of society." The Pope's remarks came during an address to a gathering of around 7,000 people belonging to an Italian association for large families.



Speaking to the families and their children, Pope Francis said he was pleased to meet them, saying it was clear that they "love the family and they love life." "Each of your children", he said, "was wanted by God" and it amazes us "how great a miracle is a child." A child is somebody who changes our life. He also underlined the important role played by grandparents, saying they can not only provide practical support but above all can help the parents pass down to their children their faith.

The Pope went on to urge politicians and the local administration to provide more support to help people with large families, lamenting that such help is not always forthcoming. He concluded his address with a special prayer for families hit by the economic crisis where either the father or mother have lost their jobs or where the young can't find employment, as well as all families struggling with solitude and divisions. And please, continue praying for me, the Pope ended, "because in a way I'm like a grandfather for all of you." (Vatican City, Rome)

THE MONASTIC CHARISM


Many communities of consecrated men live a monastic charism. For these monks consecrated life is primarily a call to community, a degree of separation from the outside world, and a healthy balance of work and prayer. Some monasteries are known for running schools and some

of the monks may teach or minister in some other capacity related to education. In other monasteries the monks are primarily engaged in farming or craftsmanship of some kind.

Saint of the Week

St. Anthony, abbot, January 17

Anthony "the Great", the "Father of Monks", ranks with those saints whose life exercised a profound influence upon succeeding generations. He was born in Middle Egypt (about 250) of distinguished parents. After their untimely deaths, he dedicated himself wholly to acts of mortification.



St. Anthony lived in solitude for about twenty years. *"His was a perfectly purified soul. No pain could annoy him, no pleasure bind him. In him was neither laughter nor sadness. The sight of the crowd did not trouble him, and the warm greetings of so many men did not move him. In a word, he was thoroughly immune to the vanities of the world, like a man unswervingly governed by reason, established in inner peace and harmony."*

The Baptism of the Lord *"Jesus allows himself to be numbered among sinners!"*

The baptism of Jesus is on his part the acceptance and inauguration of his mission as God's suffering Servant. He allows himself to be numbered among sinners; he is already "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world".²³² Already he is anticipating the "baptism" of his bloody death.²³³ Already he is coming to "fulfill all righteousness", that is, he is submitting himself entirely to his Father's will: out of love he consents to this baptism of death for the remission of our sins.²³⁴ The Father's voice responds to the Son's acceptance, proclaiming his entire delight in his Son.²³⁵ The Spirit whom Jesus possessed in fullness from his conception comes to "rest on him".²³⁶ Jesus will be the source of the Spirit for all mankind. At his baptism "the heavens were opened"²³⁷ - the heavens that Adam's sin had closed - and the waters were sanctified by the descent of Jesus and the Spirit, a prelude to the new creation. (The Catechism of the Catholic Church)

They receive a blessing and take the cup home, putting it in a place of honor. Each day during prayer time they pray for an increase of vocations. They also enter a thought, prayer, or scripture verse into a prayer journal which travels with the Elijah Cup. Over time, this diary becomes a spiritual journal for the parish. The following Sunday they return the Elijah Cup with the gifts of bread and wine at the Offertory.


SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:




Help needed to recycle plastic caps and aluminum pop tabs
