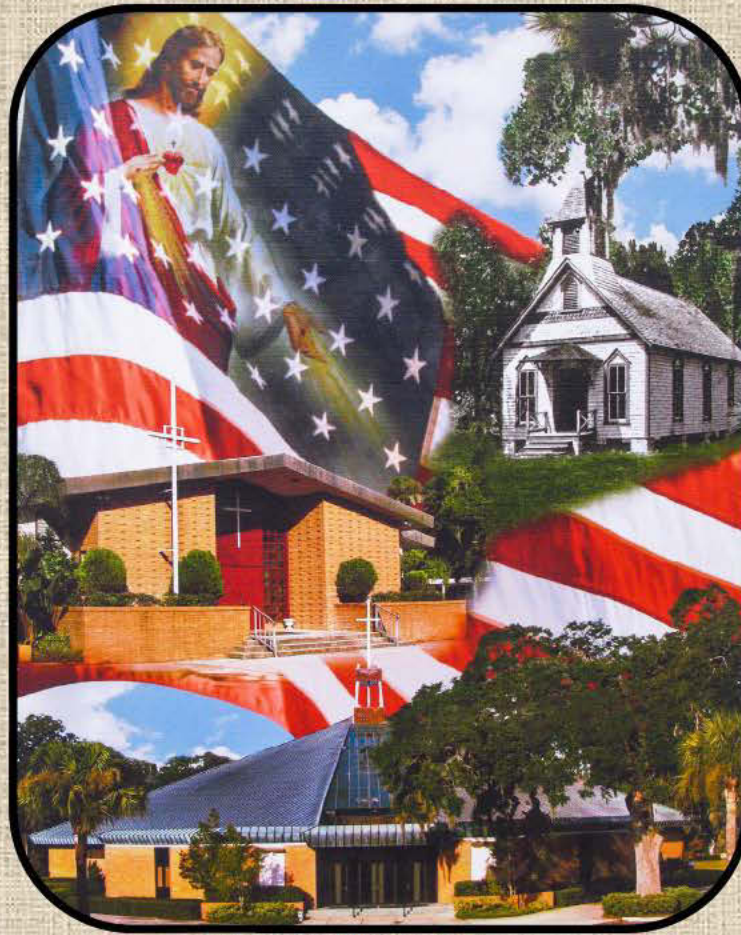

Dear Friends,

The Holy Trinity is an integral part of our faith, the understanding of which is often under emphasized. Holy Trinity Sunday was introduced into the church by Pope John XXII in the 1300's to honor the Trinity of Persons in God. Throughout the Scriptures we see various passages which bring out the reality of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, their unity, and the various roles they fulfill to accomplish their will.

Ephesians 4:4-6 is one such passage; *"There is one body and one Spirit, ... one Lord, ... one God and Father of us all."* As in this passage, an overriding characteristic of the Holy Trinity is their unity and oneness. The Holy Trinity is united in bringing about our salvation, as we see in Ephesians 1:1-14, and united in bringing about our unity and oneness. Interestingly, this unity and oneness of his Body is integral to advancing the Gospel. How scandalous it is for us who have the name of Christ, to live with, and in some cases foster ungodly divisions among ourselves. The following quote from the Catechism of the Catholic Church reveals the importance of this oneness to the spread of the Gospel. *"Thus the Church confesses, following the new Testament, 'one God and Father from whom all things are, and one Lord Jesus Christ, through whom all things are, and one Holy Spirit in whom all things are'. . . Hence the whole Christian life is a communion with each of the divine persons, without in any way separating them. Everyone who glorifies the Father does so through the Son in the Holy Spirit; everyone who follows Christ does so because the Father draws him and the Spirit moves him."*

How can we honor the Holy Trinity? First and foremost is by cooperating with the Trinity in the work of salvation. If we have ever held back a part of ourselves from fully believing and surrendering to Christ and his gracious offer of salvation for us, if we have consented only with our head and not our heart and will, we can honor the Holy Trinity by a simple prayer of surrender and welcome. Those of us who have already done so, can pause and reflect on our previous commitment, asking the Holy Trinity to reveal to us areas where we need to conform to the Father's will in different or deeper ways. Perhaps we can ask the Holy Spirit to show us how we might be more actively involved in the Trinity's work of bringing the Good News of salvation to our world. In addition, we can pause to offer a special prayer of thanksgiving for the Holy Trinity's presence in our life, and tell the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit of our love for them.

"O my God, Trinity whom I adore, help me forget myself entirely so to establish myself in you, unmovable and peaceful as if my soul were already in eternity. May nothing be able to trouble my peace or make me leave you, O my unchanging God, but may each minute bring me more deeply into your mystery! Grant my soul peace. Make it your heaven, your beloved dwelling and the place of your rest. May I never abandon you there, but may I be there, whole and entire, completely vigilant in my faith, entirely adoring, and wholly given over to your creative action".
(Prayer of the Blessed Elizabeth of the Trinity, taken from the Catechism of the Catholic Church)

Saint of the Week

Venerable Matt Talbot, June 18

Matt's father was one man who succumbed to alcoholism and spent much of the family's income on the cheap whiskey that was widely available at the time. Matt and his siblings spent little time in school and worked odd jobs to bring in extra money. Matt's first job, at age 12, was to deliver Guinness stout to pubs. He began drinking the dregs of the returned bottles and, at the age of 13, he too was an alcoholic. Even then he was known as a very hard worker, but as an adult he spent all his wages on alcohol. His friends later testified: "[Matt] only wanted one thing—the drink; he wouldn't go with us to a dance or a party or a school function. But for the drink he'd do anything."

One day he decided to take "the pledge" for three months, make a general confession and begin to attend daily Mass. There is evidence that Matt's first seven years after taking the pledge were especially difficult. Avoiding his former drinking places was hard. He began to pray as intensely as he used to drink. He also tried to pay back people from whom he had borrowed or stolen money while he was drinking.

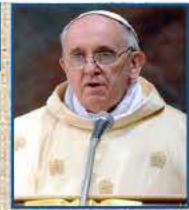
Matt joined the Secular Franciscan Order and began a life of strict penance; he abstained from meat nine months a year. Matt spent hours every night avidly reading Scripture and the lives of the saints. He prayed the rosary conscientiously. Though his job did not make him rich, Matt contributed generously to the missions.

After 1923 his health failed, and Matt was forced to quit work. He died on his way to church on Trinity Sunday. Fifty years later Pope Paul VI gave him the title venerable.



The Pope's Corner

The Holy Father recently celebrated Mass at the Vatican with a number of married couples present. Here is an excerpt:



Married life must be persevering, because otherwise love cannot go forward. Perseverance in love, in good times and in difficult times, when there are problems: problems with the children, economic problems, problems here, problems there – but love perseveres, presses on, always trying to work things out, to save the family. Persevering: they get up every morning, the man and the woman, and carry the family forward."

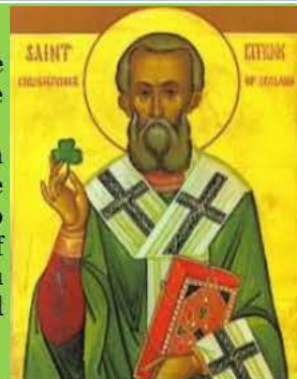
Then the Holy Father discussed another characteristic: fruitfulness. The love of Jesus, says Pope Francis, "makes the Church fruitful," providing her with new children through Baptism, and the Church grows with this spousal fruitfulness. "In a marriage," said Pope Francis, "fertility can sometimes be put to the test when the children do not arrive, or are sick." The Pope said that in such times of trial, there are couples who look to Jesus and draw on the power of fertility that Christ has with His Church. There are also other things that Jesus does not like – such as marriages that are sterile by choice:

"These marriages, in which the spouses do not want children, in which the spouses want to remain without fertility. This culture of well-being from ten years ago convinced us: 'It's better not to have children! It's better! You can go explore the world, go on holiday, you can have a villa in the countryside, you can be care-free...it might be better – more comfortable – to have a dog, two cats, and the love goes to the two cats and the dog. Is this true or is this not? Have you seen it? Then, in the end this marriage comes to old age in solitude, with the bitterness of loneliness. It is not fruitful, it does not do what Jesus does with his Church. He makes His Church fruitful.'" (Vatican Radio)

The shamrock and the Trinity!

The shamrock is a symbol both for the Holy Trinity and St. Patrick (389-461). The shamrock is a clover plant with a yellow flower and leaflets made up of a stem with three small green leaves. The plant is very common and widely distributed throughout Ireland.

There are several popular legends about how St. Patrick used the shamrock to explain the mystery of the Trinity. According to one story, St. Patrick went to Connaught where he met two of King Laoghaire's daughters, Ethne and Fedelm. St. Patrick had been unable to persuade the king to convert, but he convinced the king's daughters. During their time of instruction, St. Patrick used a shamrock to visualize the mystery of the Trinity, how a single plant with three leaves is analogous to the one Triune God with three separate and distinct Persons (Thurston, H. J., ed., Butler's Lives of the Saints, Vol. 1, 615).

The following Sunday they return the Elijah Cup with the gifts of bread and wine at the Offertory.
