

Dear Friends,

**1** his weekend Redemptorists throughout the world celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Redeemer. This feast has been celebrated by the Redemptorists on the third Sunday of July since 1749.

I'll be celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Redeemer with my brother Redemptorists in the safe environs of Central Florida. It is difficult to imagine that some of my brother Redemptorists can no longer say Mass on this important Feast day in certain parts of the world simply because they

are Christian. In particular, Christians are being displaced and persecuted throughout the Middle East, and yet the world remains silent.

For 1600 years, Sunday Mass was celebrated in Mosul, Iraq. As of last month, Sunday Mass will no longer be celebrated in Mosul. A Redemptorist, Archbishop Warda has made a special request for Catholics to pray for persecuted Christians in his country, Iraq and those throughout the world.

Why is this feast so important? The Solemnity of the Most Holy Redeemer is a reminder to all of us of the love God has for each one of us, and of the dignity and worth of each human person. We are all created in God's image and likeness, and we are created to love one another, Jew, Christian or Muslim.

Pope John II writing in 'Redemptor Hominis' gives us an insight into the beauty and magnitude of today's feast. We cannot live without love. We remain beings that are incomprehensible for ourselves, our lives are senseless, if love is not revealed to us, if we do not encounter love, if we do not experience it and make it our

own, if we do not participate intimately in it. This, as has already been said, is why Christ the Redeemer "fully reveals man to himself", 'fully reveals us to ourselves'. If we may use the expression, this is the human dimension of the mystery of the Redemption. In this dimension we find again the greatness, dignity and value that belong to our humanity. In the mystery of the Redemption we become newly "expressed" and, in a way, are newly created. We are newly created! "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus". If we wish to understand ourselves thoroughly and not just in accordance with immediate, partial, often superficial, and even illusory standards and measures of his being we must with our unrest, uncertainty and even our weakness and sinfulness, with our life and death, draw near to Christ. We must, so to speak, enter into him with all his own self, we must "appropriate" and assimilate the whole of the reality of the Incarnation and Redemption in order to find ourselves. If this profound process takes place within us, we then bear fruit not only of adoration of God but also of deep wonder at ourselves. How precious must we be in the eyes of the Creator, if we "gained so great a

Redeemer", and if God "gave his only Son in order that we should not

We thank Almighty God for the gift of his only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, our Holy Redeemer. Jesus came to take away our sins, but he also came to build up a Kingdom of love, forgiveness and peace.

Let us pray for the protection of people's rights throughout the world and for peace on earth.

#### Saint of the Week

St. Bridget, July 23

(1303?-1373)

From age seven on, Bridget had visions of Christ crucified. Her visions formed the basis for her activity—always with the emphasis on charity rather than spiritual favors.

She lived her married life in the court of the Swedish king Magnus II. Mother of eight children (the second eldest was

St. Catherine of Sweden), she lived the strict life of a penitent after her husband's death.

Bridget constantly strove to exert her good influence over Magnus; while never fully reforming, he did give her land and buildings to found a monastery for men and women. This group eventually expanded into an Order known as the Bridgetines (still inexistence).

In 1350, a year of jubilee, Bridget braved a plaguestricken Europe to make a pilgrimage to Rome. Although she never returned to Sweden, her years in Rome were far from happy, being hounded by debts and by opposition to her work against Church abuses.


A final pilgrimage to the Holy Land, marred by shipwreck and the death of her son, Charles, eventually led to her death in 1373. In 1999, she, Saints Catherine of Siena (April 29) and Teresa Benedicts of the Cross (Edith Stein, August 9) were named co-patronesses of Europe.



#### The Pope's Corner

#### "Pope Prays for Peace

Now, Lord, help us! Grant us peace, teach us peace, guide us toward peace. Open our eyes and our hearts and grant us the courage to say: 'no more war!', 'with war all is destroyed!'. Instill in us the courage to perform concrete



actions to build peace... Make us willing to listen to the cry of our citizens who ask that our arms be transformed into instruments of peace, our fears to trust and our tensions to forgiveness." This, on Sunday, 13 July, was Pope Francis' prayer for peace in the Holy Land. Once again the Pontiff prays and asks that others pray for peace, despite the fact that the language spoken in those lands still have the acrid taste of hate, of violence, of the blood of many innocent people.

To all the faithful gathered for the Angelus in St Peter's Square, he stated "I direct a concerned appeal to all of you to continue to pray with persistence for peace in the Holy Land, in light of the tragic events of these last days".

And, recalling the encounter of 8 June with Patriarch Bartholomaios, President Peres and President Abbas, "with whom we invoked the gift of peace together and heard the call to break the spiral of hate and violence", he reaffirmed forcefully that, although one could think "that this meeting was in vain", it is in fact "prayer which helps us not to allow ourselves to be defeated by evil, nor to accept violence and hate prevailing over dialogue and reconciliation".

Thus he made a double appeal. He called upon the interested parties and all local and national political leaders "not to spare prayer or any effort to end every hostility and seek the desired peace for the good of all"; and to the faithful: to follow the example of the Virgin Mary, of her silent prayer. And the Square responded with an eloquent silence. (July 13, 2014, Vatican Radio)

## The Bishop's Corner

#### Redemptorist Archbishop serving in Iraq

Archbishop Bashar Matti Warda serves the Chaldean Catholic Archdiocese of Erbil in northern Iraq. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1993 and joined the Redemptorist order. He became archbishop in 2010.

He recently spoke with senior writer Tim Drake from the National Catholic Register about the violence facing Christians in the Middle East and the primary concerns of Catholics in Iraq.

#### When were you ordained?

I entered seminary in 1981 at the age of 12. After finishing high school, I was ordained in 1993. I joined the Redemptorists in 1995 and did my licentiate in moral theology at the Catholic University in Louvain. In 1999, I went back to the Redemptorist mission in Baghdad. In 2001, I was asked to be the pastor at Baghdad's largest parish in southern Baghdad. We had 3,000 families. By the end of 2004, the violence, bombing and the killing of Catholic priests had started in Baghdad. That made it difficult for the seminary to remain in Baghdad. During that time, three of the seminary staff were kidnapped. I was asked to be director of the seminary. We ended up moving the seminary north. In 2010, I was enacted as archbishop of Erbil. We have 28,000 Chaldean Catholics. There are another 2,000 Christians from other churches.

#### Where are Christians going? Are there any safe enclaves for Christians in the Mideast?

They have gone to Syria, to Lebanon, Turkey and Jordan, but all of these are "waiting countries." People tend not to stay there. Forty-four percent of Iraqi asylum seekers are Christian. They are going to any place that will speed the process of immigration. Other families seek final settlement in Europe, Australia, New Zealand and the U.S. Those who are not able, who are too poor or do not have the means to travel, often move inside the country to places such as Erbil and northern Iraq.



#### What is RCIA

A process to introduce the teachings of the Catholic Church to individuals who wish to learn more about Catholicism including the opportunity to become a member of the Catholic Church.

#### How do I sign up for RCIA

To sign up, you can fill out a registration form at the parish office, or simply call the parish office.

#### What is the cost for attending RCIA?

There is no cost to you to attend RCIA. Sacred Heart Parish provides all that is needed for the sessions. The all-volunteer RCIA team works together to present the sessions, socials and retreats for all those who attend RCIA.

#### How many sessions can I miss?

Our desire is to have you attend all sessions. RCIA is certainly a place where you will learn about what the Catholic Church believes and teaches; however it much more than that. It is a process of getting to know Jesus Christ and growing together in community. This journey takes time and commitment on your part.

If you are not Catholic but would like to learn about our faith, you are invited to join the **Rite of Christian Initiation Inquiry Class** starting in the fall. *Inquiring does not carry any obligation to join the church*. 




you look around, you can see some of the needs in our parish church. In the months ahead, we hope to work on the ceiling lights, the church carpets, and the leaking roof.


