



Dear Friends,

## **H**e said to them, “**But who do you say that I am?**”

Two thousand years later, if Jesus were to ask us this very same question, I’m sure many of us would respond, “*You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!*” What does this proclamation of our faith mean to us as human beings, created in the image and likeness of God?

Jesus the Son of the living God, by becoming man, exalted man and woman, to a new stature. Divine life entered sinful human life and raised it to a new dignity, all human life is sacred.

Perhaps a similar question we can all ask ourselves is the following, “*Do you see the face of God in your fellow human being?*”

Think of the world's problems! For instance, in Iraq and Syria a group of fanatics are attempting to annihilate everyone who is different. Closer to home, in Missouri, with each night's violence we are reminded how far we still have to journey to heal our nation's racial divide.

I remember the first time I met an Iranian woman. I was on a boat ride with my mom in Ireland on Lake Killarney. The tour boat had many windows and it was quite windy on the lake that afternoon. The woman (from Iran) was sitting in front of my mother with her son and she kept turning around asking my mother, “*Are you sure you don't want me to roll down the window, are you sure you are OK?*”

This stranger from a far away place showed a deep awareness and concern for my mother's needs. We later found out this woman was a doctor from Iran living in Canada. That day I had a new openness and appreciation for a group of people I had only known as my enemy.

In her love for my mother I saw the face of God. This quote from Mark Twain has always been one of my favorites, “*Travel puts an end to bigotry, prejudices, and narrow mindedness*” When we fail to see the face of God in others, they are reduced to objects, they are no longer equal to us, they can be dismissed or even annihilated.

The face of God is in every human being, sometimes it is very difficult to see. Let us pray for the grace to recognize the face of God, especially in the most vulnerable, the unborn, the elderly, the poor, the homeless, the unwanted. Let us also pray for those who seek to do the world harm, that they may see the face of God in others and in themselves.


May you see the face of God in all those you meet, and may Mary our Mother watch over you and protect you always,



## Saint of the Week

**St. Monica,**  
**August 28**

Monica had at least three children who survived infancy. The oldest, Augustine (August 28), is the most famous. At the time of his father's death, Augustine was 17 and a rhetoric student in

Carthage. Monica was distressed to learn that her son had accepted the Manichean heresy (all flesh is evil) and was living an immoral life. For a while, she refused to let him eat or sleep in her house. Then one night she had a vision that assured her Augustine would return to the faith. From that time on, she stayed close to her son, praying and fasting for him. In fact, she often stayed much closer than Augustine wanted.

When he was 29, Augustine decided to go to Rome to teach rhetoric. Monica was determined to go along. One night he told his mother that he was going to the dock to say goodbye to a friend. Instead, he set sail for Rome. Monica was heartbroken when she learned of Augustine's trick, but she still followed him. She arrived in Rome only to find that he had left for Milan. Although travel was difficult, Monica pursued him to Milan.

In Milan, Augustine came under the influence of the bishop, St. Ambrose, who also became Monica's spiritual director. She accepted his advice in everything and had the humility to give up some practices that had become second nature to her (see Quote, below). Monica became a leader of the devout women in Milan as she had been in Tagaste.

She continued her prayers for Augustine during his years of instruction. At Easter, 387, St. Ambrose baptized Augustine and several of his friends. Soon after, his party left for Africa. Although no one else was aware of it, Monica knew her life was near the end. She told Augustine, "Son, nothing in this world now affords me delight. I do not know what there is now left for me to do or why I am still here, all my hopes in this world being now fulfilled." She became ill shortly after and suffered severely for nine days before her death.

## The Pope's Corner

**"To stop the unjust aggressor is licit!" - Pope Francis**



When asked by journalists about the Islamic State's aggression against Christian minorities in Iraq and US air-strikes, the Pope responded: "*In these cases where there is unjust aggression, all I can say is this: it is licit to stop the unjust aggressor. I underline the verb 'stop.'*" He added, "*I do not say bomb, make war, I say stop by some means.*"

*"With what means can they be stopped?" he asked. "These have to be evaluated. To stop the unjust aggressor is licit."*

Humanity has the right, the Pope said, "*to stop the unjust aggressor*," as well as to ensure the aggressor is "stopped so that he does not do evil."

He thanked the journalist for mentioning the minorities, who, he underlined, make up some of the many martyrs. *"There are men and women, religious minorities, not all of them Christian, and they are all equal before God,"* he said.

When asked about the possibility of visiting the Iraq war zone, he said he was "*willing to [go there.]*" He continued: *"When we heard with my collaborators about the killings of the religious minorities, the problem at that moment in Kurdistan was that they could not receive so many people," and we pondered "What can be done?"*

In response, he said Fr. Lombardi issued the communiqué in his name, sending it to all the nunciatures, so it could reach governments. He added they also wrote a letter to the Secretary General of the United Nations, and, finally, decided to send a personal envoy there, Cardinal Fernando Filoni, prefect of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples.

He reiterated: *"I said if it were necessary when we return from Korea, we can go there,"* adding: *"At the moment it is not the best thing to do, but I am ready for this."* (Zenit, August 19, 2014)


## Prayer to the Immaculate Queen of Peace



**The Elijah Cup** At Sunday Mass the celebrant will use the Elijah Cup as the chalice. After Communion, he calls a family, individual, or couple forward to receive the Elijah Cup. They receive a blessing and take the cup home, putting it in a place of honor. Each day during prayer time they pray for an increase of vocations. They also enter a thought, prayer, or scripture verse into a prayer journal which travels with the Elijah Cup. Over time, this diary becomes a spiritual journal for the parish. The following Sunday they return the Elijah Cup with the gifts of bread and wine at the Offertory.
