

Saint of the Week

St. Januarius, September 19 (died 305?)

"A dark mass that half fills a

hermetically sealed four-inch glass container, and is preserved in a double reliquary in the Naples cathedral as the blood of St. January, liquefies 18 times during the year. This phenomenon goes back to the 14th century. Tradition connects it with a certain Eusebia, who had allegedly collected the blood after the martyrdom. The ceremony accompanying the liquefaction is performed by holding the reliquary close to the altar on which is located what is believed to be the martyr's head. While the people pray, often tumultuously, the priest turns the reliquary up and down in the full sight of the onlookers until the liquefaction takes place. Various experiments have been applied, but the phenomenon eludes natural explanation. There are, however, similar miraculous claims made for the blood of John the Baptist. Stephen, Pantaleon, Patricia, Nicholas of Tolentino and Aloysius Gonzaga—nearly all in the neighborhood of Naples" (Catholic Encyclopedia).

Did You Know??

There are three classes of sacred relics. The first-class is a part of the saint's body. (It is this type which is placed in an altar stone.) The second-class is a piece of the saint's clothing or something used by the saint, while the third-class is an object which has been touched to a first-class relic.

Isn't the veneration of relics optional for Catholics? Must the Catholic faithful really esteem the bodies of the saints? Once and for all, the Council of Trent (16th century) responded to the claims of the reformers that both the veneration of the saints and their relics is contrary to Sacred Scripture. The Council taught: "Also the holy bodies of the holy martyrs and of the others who dwell with Christ . . . are to be honored by the faithful."

There are several scriptural passages that support the veneration of relics. For example, the Israelites took Joseph's bones when they departed Egypt (Ex. 13:19). The bones of Elisha came in contact with a dead person who then was raised to life (2 Kings 13:21). The same Elisha took the mantle of Elijah and fashioned a miracle with it (2 Kings 2:13). The Christians of Ephesus, by using handkerchiefs and cloths touched to St. Paul's skin, effected the healing of the sick (Acts 19:12).

The Pope's Corner

"Love Your Enemies!
- Pope Francis
In his homily at Thursday
morning Mass in the chapel of
the Santa Marta residence at the Vatican,
Pope Francis said that loving one's
enemies is the model of Christian life."

Reflecting on the Gospel reading from St. Luke (6:27-38), in which the Lord tells his disciples, "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you," the Holy Father said that this is a model of Christian life – of unconditional love in action.

"Do good," he said, "lend without hoping to have back what you have lent - [act] without interest, and your reward will be great." Pope Francis also recognized that this new way of the Gospel is one by which it is often difficult to live: "But Father' [one might say], 'I don't feel like behaving that way'. 'Well', [one might reply], 'if you don't feel like it, that's your problem, but that's the Christian way." This is that way that Jesus teaches us. 'And what can I hope?' [one might ask]. Go on Jesus' way, which is the way of mercy. Be merciful as your father is merciful. Only with a merciful heart can we do all that, which the Lord counsels us to do – all the way. The Christian life is not a navel-gazing one. It is a life in which one gets out of oneself in order to give oneself to others. It is a gift, it is love – and love does not turn in on itself, it is not selfish, but selfqiving." (Vatican Radio)

WHY DID THE WORD BECOME FLESH?

The Word became flesh for us in order to save us by reconciling us with God, who "loved us and sent his Son to be the expiation for our sins": "the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world", and "he was revealed to take away sins": (Catechism of the Catholic Church)

Reflection on Today's Gospel

Jesus links his victory on the cross with Moses act of deliverance

Jesus clearly links Moses' act of deliverance in the wilderness with his impending sacrificial death when he is "lifted up" on the wood of the cross at Calvary. Unlike Moses' deliverance in the wilderness which only resulted in temporary relief for the people, Jesus' atoning death on the cross brought decisive victory over sin, Satan, and death. Jesus' victory on the cross cancels the debt of our sin, and releases us from guilt and condemnation. His death and victory brings us new life - the new abundant life in his Holy Spirit which lasts forever. Jesus' victory on the cross also brought about his glorious bodily resurrection to new unending life and to his ascension to the right hand of the Father in heaven where he now rules and intercedes for us. The result of Jesus "being lifted up on the cross," and his rising and exaltation to the Father's right hand in heaven, is our "new birth in the Spirit" and adoption as sons and daughters of God. God not only has redeemed us from sin in Christ, he also fills us with his own divine life through the gift of his Spirit that we might share in his own glory.

We, the Eucharistic communities of Sacred Heart and St. Gerard, being faithful to the Mission of the Church as expressed by the Redemptorist way of life, seek and invite others into an ever deepening relationship with Jesus and with one another. Seeking to build up the Kingdom of God, empowered by the Holy Spirit, nourished by the Sacraments and Prayer, we commit to reaching out to everyone through evangelization, especially to those most in need.




