



Dear Friends,

This Sunday we begin our second annual drive for the purchasing of memorial bricks to be placed in the Father Browne Memorial Garden. Like last year, we plan to have a blessing of all the new memorial bricks purchased within the last year. The blessing of the bricks will take place after the 4:00 Mass on Saturday, February 21. If you would like your brick blessed on February 21, your order must be placed by January 10th.

The Father Browne Memorial Garden has been a huge success. How do I measure success?

- For instance, over 100 animals came out to be blessed for the Blessing of Animals last Friday. How meaningful I thought, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, and animals all around the garden, cats, dogs, fish, birds, possum, rabbits, etc.
- Every day a parishioner or two walks into the garden to sit for a moment in quiet prayer or reflection.
- Now, groups of school children find their way into the garden to pray, to study, and to have fun.

But I am touched and most gratified when I hear stories of parishioners going into the garden to stand at the memorial brick with the name of a loved one printed on it. Many of our parishioners find it too difficult to visit the graves of family members, so they purchase memorial bricks in their memory. It is not uncommon for family members to come to the Prayer Garden and pray together for their loved ones under the majestic oak tress.

We hear in the gospel this morning, *"The feast is ready,"* also, *"the hall was filled with guests!"* This morning after the 9:00 Mass in the Social Hall we are going to say thanks to a group of special parishioners who have shown great kindness to Sacred Heart Parish. We want to show our appreciation for their thoughtfulness by inviting them to a special feast in our hall.

Because of the generosity of these parishioners and others like them, we have a special outdoor place on the parish grounds where we can be alone with God to pray and experience God's peace.

Finally, next month is November, the month dedicated to all those who have gone before us, **All Saints Day and All Souls Day**. As Catholics, we can continue to reach out to our brothers and sisters who have died, we can pray for them!

Perhaps during November we can have a candle light prayer service in the Father Browne Prayer Garden as we pray for all of our deceased loved ones.

If one person has been brought into a deeper relationship with God as a result of the Father Browne Prayer Garden, ***I will say, "The Prayer Garden has been a success!"***

God bless you and may Mary our Mother protect you and watch over you always.

Saint of the Week

ST. GERARD MAJELLA, October 16

St. Gerard Majella was born in Muro Lucano, Italy, on April 6, 1726, into a family of humble circumstances. From his parents Gerard learned the love of prayer and sacrifice. When his father died, Gerard, being the only son, had to provide for his family by working as a tailor. At the age of 14 he sought to enter the Capuchin friary but was rejected because of his poor health. After a short time as the domestic servant of the bishop of Lacedonia, he returned to tailoring but earned a minimal income.

In April 1749 after attending a Redemptorist mission in Muro, Gerard succeeded in getting himself accepted by the congregation. Following a trial period and a year of novitiate in the house at Deliceto, he professed religious vows on July 16, 1752. Gerard was noted for his observance of the Redemptorist rule, and collecting money for the material needs of the community. His presence to people who were weighed down by poverty and illiteracy was a sign of hope to them. Gerard had great empathy and testified to trust in the love and the compassion of God.

During his five years as a lay brother in the congregation, Gerard was remarkable for his apostolic zeal, patience in sickness, love for the poor, deep humility in the face of false accusation, heroic obedience, spirit of penance and constancy in prayer. He wrote numerous letters of spiritual direction. The Lord favored him with many spiritual gifts, including prophecy, the reading of people's hearts, and the gifts of miracles. He died at Materdomini on October 16, 1755.

Gerard was beatified by Leo XII on January 29, 1893, and canonized by St. Pius X on December 11, 1904. He is invoked as patron of mothers, especially in time of pregnancy. Couples hoping to conceive a child also seek St. Gerard's intercession.

This Week's Scripture Meditation:

- The Royal Wedding Party

What can a royal wedding party tell us about God's kingdom? One of the most beautiful images used in the scriptures to depict what heaven is like is the wedding celebration and royal feast given by the King for his newly-wed son and bride. Whatever grand feast we can imagine on earth, heaven is the feast of all feasts because the Lord of heaven and earth invites us to the most important banquet of all - not simply as bystanders or guests - but as members of Christ's own body, his bride the church! The last book in the bible ends with an invitation to the wedding feast of the Lamb - the Lord Jesus who offered his life as an atoning sacrifice for our sins and who now reigns as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. **The Spirit and the Bride say, Come!** (Revelations 22:17). The Lord Jesus invites us to be united with himself in his heavenly kingdom of peace and righteousness.

The second part of today's gospel story focuses on those who had no claim on the king and who would never have considered getting such an invitation. The "good and the bad" along the highways certainly referred to the Gentiles and to sinners. This is certainly an invitation of grace - undeserved, unmerited favor and kindness! But this invitation also contains a warning for those who refuse it or who approach the wedding feast unworthily. Grace is a free gift, but it is also an awesome responsibility.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a Christian teacher and pastor who died for his faith under Hitler's Nazi regime, contrasts cheap grace and costly grace. *"Cheap grace is the grace we bestow on ourselves...the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance ..grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate. ..Costly grace is the gospel which must be sought again and again, the gift which must be asked for, the door at which a man must knock. Such grace is costly because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life."*

THE SYNOD ON THE FAMILY BEGINS



Dear families, good evening

The evening falls on our assembly. It is the hour in which one willingly returns home to the same meal, in the thick of affections, of the good that has been done and received, of the encounters which warm the heart and make it grow, good wine which anticipates in the days of man the feast without end.

It is also the most weighty hour for he who finds himself face to face with his own loneliness, in the bitter twilight of broken dreams and plans: how many people trudge through the day in the blind alley of resignation, abandonment, even resentment: in how many homes was the wine of joy less plenty, therefore, the zest – and the wisdom – of life. For one another we make our prayer heard.

It is significant how – even in the individualistic culture which distorts and renders connections fleeting – in each person born of a woman, there remains alive an essential need of stability, of an open door, of someone with whom to weave and to share the story of life, a history to which to belong.

The communion of life assumed by spouses, their openness to the gift of life, the mutual protection, the encounter and the memory of generations, educational support, the transmission of the Christian faith to their children . . . With all this, the family continues to be a school without parallel of humanity, an indispensable contribution to a just and united society. (cfr Esort. ap. Evangelii gaudium, 66 -68).

And the deeper its roots, the more it is possible in life to leave and to go far, without getting lost or feeling out of place in foreign lands.

This horizon helps us to grasp the importance of the Synodal assembly, which opens tomorrow. Already, the "convenire in unum" surrounding the Bishop of Rome is an event of grace, in which episcopal collegiality is made manifest in a path of spiritual and pastoral discernment.

To search for that which today the Lord asks of His Church, we must lend our ears to the beat of this time and perceive the "scent" of the people today, so as to remain permeated with their joys and hopes, by their sadness and distress, at which time we will know how to propose the good news of the family with credibility (Pope Francis - 10-6-2014, the Vatican)





The Elijah Cup

At Sunday Mass the celebrant will use the Elijah Cup as the chalice. After Communion, he calls a family, individual, or couple forward to receive the Elijah Cup. They receive a blessing and take the cup home, putting it in a place of honor. Each day during prayer time they pray for an increase of vocations. They also enter a thought, prayer, or scripture verse into a prayer journal which travels with the Elijah Cup. Over time, this diary becomes a spiritual journal for the parish. The following Sunday they return the Elijah Cup with the gifts of bread and wine at the Offertory.






