

Dear friends,

(THIS WEEKEND'S REFLECTION IS FROM EMMAUS JOURNEY)

With today's climate of fixation on the stock market and our economic situation, we ought to be able to clearly make sense of this week's Gospel reading. Imagine if you will, how you would feel if during prosperous times you divided a large portion of your net worth among three stockbrokers. Then, after some time, two of them report back to you that they have made substantial returns on

your investment, while the third one reports back that he didn't even invest your money, but held it for safe keeping. You would be somewhat miffed also. You would probably take back your money from the third stockbroker, and give it to the one who had seen the best returns.

When we become members of God's family and followers of Jesus, he invests the Holy Spirit into our lives. With the Holy Spirit comes new gifts and chrisms, which God intends to be used along with our natural abilities, to advance and grow his kingdom. Some, with false humility, bemoan that they don't really have any gifts or abilities. This is not only untrue but also an illegitimate excuse. If we have the Holy Spirit, we have gifts and abilities.

Recently, our parish priest along with a team of individuals, visited our sister parish in Sumi, Ukraine. While there they met a woman who had been bedridden with arthritis for some 24 years. Though her body was made inactive, her faith thrived as she grew in holiness and prayer. As they prepared to leave she blessed them and Holy Apostles Parish back in the U.S. All those present knew that they were standing in the presence of a holy, godly woman whose faith was alive and active even though her body was immobile. Had she dared to have hidden behind her physical limitations and offered the excuse, "I have no gifts; I cannot do anything in my condition," both she and the Body of Christ would have been the poorer. So it is when you fail to invest the gifts God has invested in you.

This week's second reading indicates that we are sons and daughters of the light. This phrase reminds us of Jesus' admonition that, we are to be "salt" and" light." Salt should whet people's appetite for God and light should illuminate their darkness and give them hope. What is it that Jesus is actually referring to if not the utilization of our gifts and abilities for other's well-being? He said that we should let our light shine before men, that they would see our "good works," here on earth and glorify God who is in heaven. So rather than be complacent, doing little or nothing we should be investing the gifts Jesus gives us.

In the parable in this week's Gospel reading the master never criticized the fact that the work of one servant did not match or exceed the work of another. Rather he commended each for their effort to make the most with what had been entrusted to them. Each received, "Well done, good and faithful servant." The only displeasure shown was toward the one who did

not attempt to advance the master's interest by working as best he could. If the Lord returns suddenly, will he find you occupied using for his Kingdom what he has invested in you?

When next you find yourself hesitating to get involved using your gifts, think of Saint Catherine of Siena, one of only two women ever to receive the title of "Doctor of the Church." "She was a woman ... She was a lay person ... Most striking of all, she was almost illiterate ... Catherine's humble background and lack of education may have made her an unlikely candidate for such an honor, but they never hindered her ability to receive divine revelation. In fact, God has so consistently revealed His word to the poor and the humble that, as Paul VI put it, we can consider them to be 'God's preferential choice." (From Catherine of Siena: A Biography by Anne B. Baldwin) What if Catherine had simply said, "I can't. I have nothing to offer"?



The Pope's Corner

Pope Francis: Discarding Individuals Will Not Achieve Peace or Justice

In a letter addressed to Prime Minister Tony Abbott of Australia, Pope Francis warned that a "mindset in which individuals are ultimately discarded will never achieve peace or justice."



"Throughout the world, the G20 countries included, there are far too many women and men suffering from severe malnutrition, a rise in the number of the unemployed, an extremely high percentage of young people without work and an increase in social exclusion which can lead to criminal activity and even the recruitment of terrorists," the Holy Father wrote.

"In addition, there are constant assaults on the natural environment, the result of unbridled consumerism, and this will have serious consequences for the world economy."

Expressing his hope that a productive consensus can arise, the

Expressing his hope that a productive consensus can arise, the Pope commented on the current situation of global security and peace, particularly in the Middle East. He also called for a broader agreement between the countries, through the United Nations legal system, to end aggression against minorities, religious and ethnic groups.

The agreement, he said, should "lead to eliminating the root causes of terrorism, which has reached proportions hitherto unimaginable; these include poverty, underdevelopment and exclusion."

The Pope also stated that there is a need for education, that religion may not be used to justify acts of violence. "The situation in the Middle East has revived a debate about the responsibility of the international community to protect individuals and peoples from extreme attacks on human rights and a total disregard for humanitarian law," he wrote. "The international community, and in particular the G20 Member States, should also give thought to the need to protect citizens of all countries from forms of aggression that are less evident but equally real and serious."

Saint of the Week

St. Agnes of Assisi, November 19 (1197-1253)

Agnes was the sister of St. Clare and her first follower. When Agnes left home two weeks after Clare's departure, their family attempted to bring Agnes back by force. They tried to drag her out of the monastery, but all of a sudden her body became so heavy that several knights could not budge it. Her uncle Monaldo tried to



strike her but was temporarily paralyzed. The knights then left Agnes and Clare in peace.

Agnes matched her sister in devotion to prayer and in willingness to endure the strict penances which characterized their lives at San Damiano. In 1221 a group of Benedictine nuns in Monticelli (near Florence) asked to become Poor Clares. St. Clare sent Agnes to become abbess of that monastery. Agnes soon wrote a rather sad letter about how much she missed Clare and the other nuns at San Damiano. After establishing other Poor Clare monasteries in northern Italy, Agnes was recalled to San Damiano in 1253 when Clare was dying.

Agnes followed Clare in death three months later, and was canonized in 1753.

Comment:

God must love irony; the world is so full of it. In 1212, many in Assisi surely felt that Clare and Agnes were wasting their lives and were turning their backs on the world. In reality, their lives were tremendously life-giving, and the world has been enriched by the example of these poor contemplatives.

Vocation Awareness

Charles de Foucauld, founder of the Little Brothers and Sisters of Jesus, said: "One must pass through solitude and dwell in it to receive God's grace. It is there that one empties oneself, that one drives before oneself all that is not God, and that one completely empties this little house of our soul to leave room for God alone. In



doing this, do not fear being unfaithful toward creatures. On the contrary, that is the only way for you to serve them effectively" (Raphael Brown, Franciscan Mystic, p. 126).

Scripture Reflection for the Day

Why did Jesus tell this story and what can it teach us? Most importantly it tells us something about how God deals with us, his disciples and servants. The parable first of the Master's trust in his servants. While he goes away he leaves them with his money to use as they think best. While there were no strings attached, this was obviously a test to see if the Master's workers would be industrious and reliable in their use of the money entrusted to them. The master rewards those who are industrious and faithful and he punishes those who sit by idly and who do nothing with his money.

What do coins and the law of economics have to do with the kingdom of God? The Lord entrusts the subjects of his kingdom with gifts and graces and he gives his subjects the freedom to use them as they think best. With each gift and talent, God gives sufficient means (grace and wisdom) for using them in a fitting way. As the parable of the talents shows, God abhors indifference and an attitude that says it's not worth trying. God honors those who use their talents and gifts for doing good. Those who are faithful with even a little are entrusted with more! But those who neglect or squander what God has entrusted to them will lose what they have.

There is an important lesson here for us. No one can stand still for long in the Christian life. We either get more or we lose what we have. We either advance towards God or we slip back. Let us pray that we always be thankful for our gifts and that we respond generously in return by making good use of our talents, time, and treasure.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Old St. Rita's Catholic Church Mission Building is one of the oldest surviving church buildings in the city (Duss St.). It was built in 1899 as the Sacred Heart

Catholic Church of New Smyrna, moved to this site in 1956 to serve the colored Catholics in the Westside Community, and was named St. Rita's Colored Mission Church (Black Heritage Museum).

A parishioner, Ferdinand Nordmann supplied the land and the materials to build our first parish church back in 1899. Our parish has come a long way since little St. Rita's, seating only 80 people. We thank God for all our blessings. Let us pray especially during this month of November for all the deceased parishioners of Sacred Heart parish who have helped build this wonderful community of faith - Fr. Murray



Why learn CPR and how to use an AED?

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is an emergency medical procedure for a victim of Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA). An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is a portable electronic device that is able to treat SCA victims by application of electrical therapy which allows the heart to re-establish an effective rhythm.

SCA's claim 400,000 lives each year. If defibrillation can be performed within the first 1-3 minutes, often before EMS has arrived, there is a 70-80 percent chance of survival.

To receive CPR AED certification, the training session requires a two-hour time commitment and hands-on skills practice session
