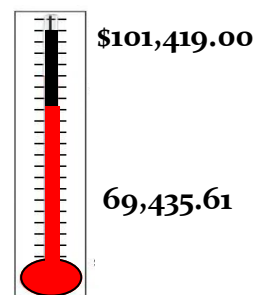

everything was under control the entire day!

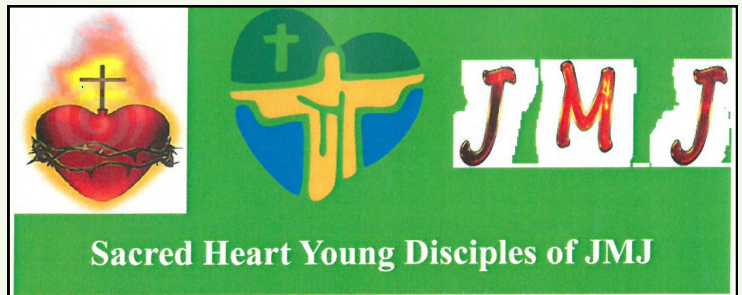

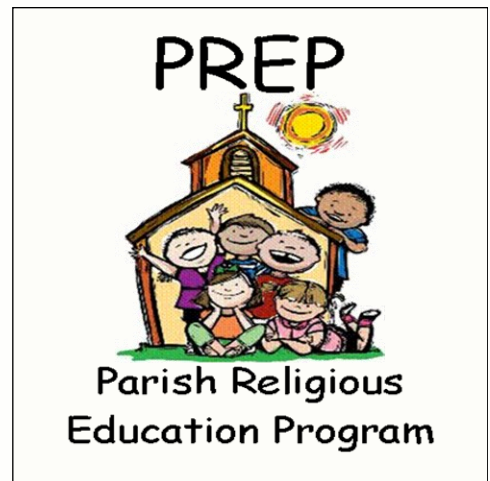
## Religious Education Program 2018 – 2019

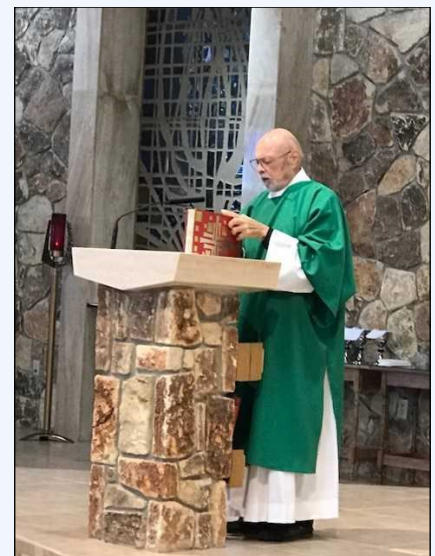

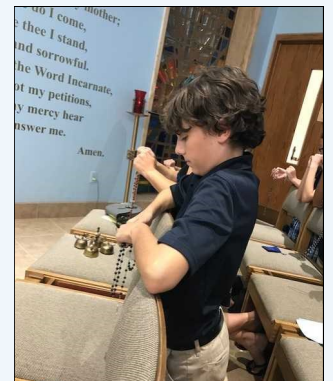
**Confirmation Candidates :**

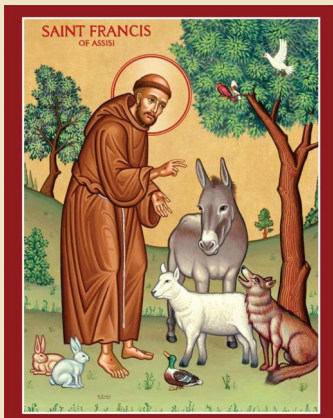
Let us continue to keep our students in our prayers and ask the help of the Holy Spirit to give the gifts they need to live out their Catholic faith.

### St. Gerard's Memorial Brick Program

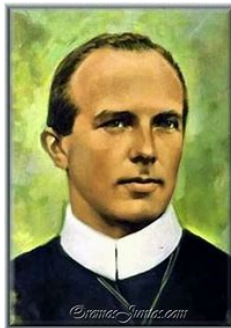

### Feast of Blessed Kaspar Stanggassinger 9/26/18

(January 12, 1871 - September 26, 1899)



A German Roman Catholic priest and a professed member from the Redemptorists. His inclination to the priesthood manifested from his childhood and he soon became a seminarian before deciding not to be just a diocesan priest but one part of a religious order after a spiritual experience directed him towards the Redemptorist charism. He was

ordained to the priesthood in 1895 and soon began teaching and overseeing new seminarians despite his desire to go out to the missions in Brazil. The beatification cause commenced in 1960 and he later became titled as Venerable upon the confirmation of his life of heroic virtue in 1986; he was later beatified not long after this in 1988.

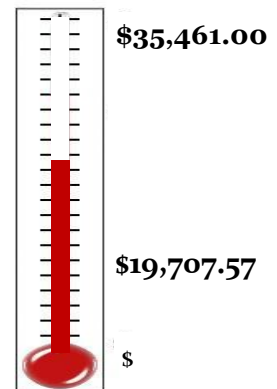
