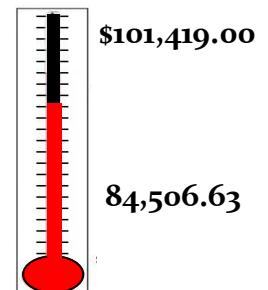

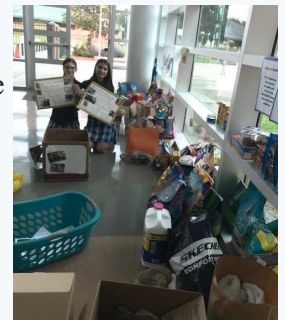

Sacred Heart 8th Grade students clocked in hundreds of service hours

It is very rare nowadays to have a group of students think about and serve the poor on a consistent and regular basis but at Sacred Heart Catholic School students as young as 4th grade but most especially 8th graders take on the challenge to get every opportunity they have to reach out to people in need. From August of 2018 to present, members of the 8th grade class lead and have clocked in hundreds of hours of service on what the school calls “Young Discipleship.” Members of the graduating class continued the initiatives of graduates Matthew M. of Matthew’s Meals (food drive) and Parker K. of Parker’s Project (homelessness) and added their own .



Some of the most powerful projects that prove the school’s advocacy on servant and missionary leadership being a Redemptorist school are Jackson and Allison C’s, “Calvo’s Bottles for Change,” one of the most successful projects this year that benefits the soup kitchen and the homeless; Finn J’s “Finn’s Closet” delivered clothes, shoes, and jackets to the soup kitchen and F.R.O.G; Zadia F. and Abbey L’s. “Food for Pets” that benefitted the local humane society; Jack K’s books for a local school’s reading program; Bridget L’s “Cups of Love” that helps give cheer to the elderly in nursing homes; Tristan H’s blanket project for the homeless; Delaney S. and Hailey T’s baby products collection for the Pregnancy Crisis Center; Ella D. and Mia R’s “Quilt of Remembrance;” Conner M’s care packs drive, and many more.



As a school, Sacred Heart students collect uniforms, clothes, shoes, and peanut butter for our sister diocese in the Dominican Republic. Although there are many more initiatives to mention, the entire school community shows every day how they live out the Redemptorist charism of caring for the poor and most abandoned in our community.

Most importantly, many of the children who lead these programs are parishioners of Sacred Heart Parish, the future of our Church!



Mrs. Jeannie Ferguson: A disciple on a mission

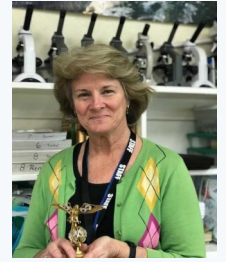
