

TEST YOUR HEALTH IQ QUIZ

True or Myth, you decide:

- 1. You should not ice a burn
- 2. CPR does not require mouth to mouth breathing
- 3. Antiperspirants and deodorants cause cancer
- 4. Eating Carrots can help your eyesight
- 5. You should tilt your head back if you have a nose bleed
- 6. Holding back a sneeze is unhealthy
- 7. You can get the flu more than once in a season
- 8. You can stop taking an antibiotic prescription when you symptoms disappear
- 9. Poison ivy is contagious from the person that has the rash
- 10. You need less sleep as you age

Answers

- 1. True, a better option is to immerse the burn is cool water at least 5 minutes in order to prevent cell damage. Do not intentionally break a blister. Wash gently with soap and water and cover.
- 2. True, according to a 2017 study survivor rates were up with only uninterrupted chest compressions.
- 3. Myth, research can not confirm the link that temporary blocking of sweat by antiperspirants/deodorants causes cancer.
- 4. Myth, this is perpetuated by their orange color beta carotene that converts to vitamin A. This conversion is not very effective so eating green leafy vegetables, high in vitamin A is better .
- 5. Myth, its best to tip your head slightly forward and gently pinch you nose so that you don't swallow blood which can cause nausea and vomiting.
- 6. True, before you sneeze pressure builds in you lungs and needs somewhere to go. If you hold your nose it could be rerouted to your ears and lead to damage.
- 7. True, many flu strains circulate each season. Best to practice prevention practices e.g. Good hand washing, covering your mouth and nose along with the flu shot.
- 8. Myth, always complete your antibiotic/medication prescription as ordered. Symptoms may fade before the infection is completely gone and can return.
- 9. Myth, coming in contact with the plant or sap causes the rash. Although the sap must be washed off the infected person as well.
- 10. Myth, the CDC recommends that adults sleep at least 7 hours for optimal health.



Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are lay ministers who nave been communed of Orlando to assist the priest in have been commissioned by the Bishop distributing Holy Communion at Mass.

They serve at all Masses at Saint Gerard's Church – Saturdays at 4:30 pm, Sundays at 10:00 am,

Wednesdays and First Friday at 9:00 am, Holy Days, Funeral Masses and, with special training, visits to the homebound.

Catholics in good standing must be recommended by the Pastor to the Diocese of Orlando. They are initially trained by the Diocese in a three hour class. These classes are held in various locations throughout the year. Once trained, the mandates are good for 5 years. After the initial training, Extraordinary Ministers receive instruction on the procedures at Saint Gerard's Church. Schedules are posted monthly. Ministers can indicate at what Mass they prefer to serve, and are asked to find a substitute if they are unable to serve on their scheduled day. They may be asked to arrive thirty minutes to an hour before Mass to help prepare for the Eucharistic celebration.

> Baptized and confirmed Catholics are qualified to be Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.
