


Ministry News

On April 28, 2018, the Second Sunday of Easter (or Sunday of Divine Mercy) Please join us at 3:00 PM in the church for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

Jesus said to St. Faustina, "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of mercy upon the souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet ...





Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are lay ministers who have been commissioned by the Bishop of Orlando to assist the priest in distributing Holy Communion at Mass.

They serve at all Masses at Saint

Gerard's Church – Saturdays at 4:30 pm, Sundays at 10:00 am, Wednesdays and First Friday at 9:00 am, Holy Days, Funeral Masses and, with special training, visits to the homebound.

Catholics in good standing must be recommended by the Pastor to the Diocese of Orlando. They are initially trained by the Diocese in a three hour class. These classes are held in various locations throughout the year. Once trained, the mandates are good for 5 years. After the initial training, Extraordinary Ministers receive instruction on the procedures at Saint Gerard's Church. Schedules are posted monthly. Ministers can indicate at what Mass they prefer to serve, and are asked to find a substitute if they are unable to serve on their scheduled day. They may be asked to arrive thirty minutes to an hour before Mass to help prepare for the Eucharistic celebration.

> Baptized and confirmed Catholics are qualified to be Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR MINISTRIES AT ST. GERARD'S

ALUMINUM POP TAB COLLECTION



The POP TAB collection period for 2019 – 2020 has begun, so I ask you again to please start saving those POP

TAB's for The Ronald McDonald Houses in Orlando. They depend greatly on these yearly collections, donated by the schools participating in this program to help offset the cost to shelter, comfort and care for the families waiting for their children to be healed at the local

hospitals. Our collection is funneled through Chisholm Elementary School in NSB.

As mentioned in the last write-up, our collection for 2018-2019 came up a little short by 15 pounds of POP TABS based on the banner year, we had the prior collection period. Something to think about; it takes 1,280 POP TAB's to = 1 lb. One (1) lb. = 16 oz. or 256 drams or 7,000 grains, each POP TAB weighs .0125 oz. or .2 drams or 5.46875 grains. Therefore, to match the collection of that banner year we will have to collect an additional 19,200 POP TABS this collection period. We can do it again.
