

ST. GERARD— FEAST DAY OCT 16



He was able to do extraordinary things, such as reading people's hearts and souls and curing their illnesses, and many miracles were attributed to him during his short life, as well as after his death from tuberculosis in 1755 at the age of 29.St. Gerard was especially devoted to helping the poor and needy, providing for both their spiritual and physical needs with his special God-given

gifts. For example, St. Gerard (like our Lord) was able to multiply loaves of bread for them on occasion. (No wonder he has been called a "wonder worker"!) Although a tailor by trade, his love of God propelled him to seek a religious vocation early on. After denied entry into the Capuchins because of his health, he entered the Redemptorist order as a lay brother in 1749, and worked there as a tailor, cook, sacristan, and infirmarian, among his other duties. The great Saint Alphonus Liguori, the founder of the Redemptorists, called him "a miracle of obedience", as he obeyed his superiors both when they were present and absent as well, by reading their thoughts!

The children drew on their plates food items that they would like to share with the poor. They also re-enacted those who are poor and homeless and needed help from God and from us.














Religious Education Program 2019-20 Updates:

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are lay ministers who Eucharistic have been commissioned by the of Orlando to assist the priest in have been commissioned by the Bishop distributing Holy Communion at Mass. They serve at all Masses at Saint

Gerard's Church – Saturdays at 4:30 pm, Sundays at 10:00 am, Wednesdays and First Friday at 9:00 am, Holy Days, Funeral Masses and, with special training, visits to the homebound. Catholics in good standing must be recommended by the Pastor to the Diocese of Orlando. They are initially trained by the Diocese in a three hour class. These classes are held in various locations throughout the year. Once trained, the mandates are good for 5 years. After the initial training, Extraordinary Ministers receive instruction on the procedures at Saint Gerard's Church. Schedules are posted monthly. Ministers can indicate at what Mass they prefer to serve, and are asked to find a substitute if they are unable to serve on their scheduled day. They may be asked to arrive thirty minutes to an hour before Mass to help prepare for the Eucharistic celebration.

> Baptized and confirmed Catholics are qualified to be Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.
