

Letter from our Pastor

I greet you with continued prayers for your health and the health of your families.

As we prepare to begin to open our Churches in stages, leading to full participation in the Eucharistic

Celebration, I speak to you as part of the Body of Christ of the Sacred Heart/St. Gerard family.

As we begin to gather, I ask you to "be your brother's keeper," to ensure that when we finally come together as one family again, none of us is missing.

As much as we all want to warmly greet those we have been separated from, please, maintain social distancing of at least 8 feet and proper cleanliness protocols for the health and safety of all in our faith community.

Unfortunately, we must be strict in enforcing these safety protocols, so your cooperation is necessary. Please understand and follow all procedures, and if you see a brother or sister in need of support in understanding or following these new and sometimes strange procedures, show them Christ's love and help them. "Love your neighbor as yourself," and benefit the health and safety of the entire Body of Christ.

As we continue to follow Diocesan guidelines for staged reopening, we will make every effort to keep you informed as guidelines may change. Your continued patience, understanding and cooperation are greatly appreciated in these unprecedented times.

Presently, as Sacred Heart's new pews are being installed during this month, we will continue to live stream Holy Mass through our media sites. When Mass resumes in the church, all Masses will be celebrated at Sacred Heart with St. Gerard reopening in the future

When the Church reopens:

- We will be able to allow a limited number of people into the sanctuary to enable appropriate social distancing.
- Only the main entrance and the doors nearest the handicap parking on the school side of the church will be open.
- People may be denied entrance or asked to leave if numbers becomes greater than social distancing allows. Hand Sanitizers will be available at entrances, as well as disposable gloves, if you do not have your own.
- However, we will not be providing masks, though we highly recommend you bring and wear your own. Seating will follow social distancing guidelines.
- Masses will be celebrated by one of our Redemptorist priests assisted by our deacons. We will not, at this time, be utilizing altar servers, lectors or Eucharistic Ministers.
- In keeping with Diocesan mandates, distribution of Communion will be in the species of Body only, and reception will be in hand only. It is permissible, for now, to receive the Holy Eucharist in gloved hand.
- When the celebration of Mass has ended it is important not to congregate into groups, but to clear the Church expediently, for cleaning and disinfecting must begin.
- Always maintain proper distance and please, do not make our clergy the enforcers.

Anyone wishing the Sacrament of Reconciliation is advised to call the Parish Office or contact one of the priests at the Rectory.






St. Bernardine of Siena (Priest) The Italian priest St. Bernardine of Siena (1380-1444)


SVdP/Sacred Heart Church—News
