

No cross the person is alive.

John in his characteristic humility was eager to point beyond himself to the Christ (means *Anointed One* and *Messiah*). He did not hesitate to direct his own disciples to the Lord Jesus. When two of John's disciples began to seek Jesus out, Jesus took the initiative to invite them into his company. He did not wait for them to get his attention. Instead he met them halfway. He asked them one of the most fundamental questions of life: "What are you looking for?" Jesus asks each one of us the same question: "What are you searching for? Do you know the meaning and purpose for your life?" Only God, the Father and Author of life, can answer that question and make our purpose fully known to us. That is why the Lord Jesus invites each one of us to draw near to himself. He wants us to know him personally -

to know what he came to do for us and what he wants to offer us.

Lord Jesus Christ, fill me with the power of your Holy Spirit that I may grow in the knowledge of your great love and truth. Let your Spirit be aflame in my heart that I may joyfully seek to do your will in all things.





## Fr. Joe Freund's Funeral Homily St. Alphonsus Villa, New Smyrna Beach, Fl. 1/4/21

Every Redemptorist is familiar with the words of St. Alphonsus: "Let us not lose the beautiful crown which I see prepared for everyone who lives in observance and dies in the Congregation. I am certain that Jesus has prepared a beautiful place in Paradise for those who die in the Congregation."


This is not a sad day. Fr. Joe fulfilled his promise to persevere in the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer. One picture on his desk was with the St. Mary's College Minor Seminary. Joe is standing in the back in a suit and tie, towering over the thirteen and fourteen year old boys in front of him. Joe had already completed high school in the Bronx and worked for a couple of years. The fact that he stuck it out after having to return to high school is a testament to his vocation and his perseverance.

He fulfilled his vows of poverty. His room was always neat and austere, whether he was in New York City, St. Lucia, or here in Florida. A few collared shirts hung in his closet with some well worn shoes underneath. There were no expensive watches or club memberships. His poverty was a lived reality - a quiet, unhurried poverty that grew even more streamlined as he grew older.

Chastity is always harder in the early years of religious life. Thankfully, the routine of prayer and pastoral work helps all of us. Interestingly, Fr. Joe found another outlet to help - creative writing. His desk was filled with completed short stories that he had written over the years. My favorite title is from a fifty page story, "Murder in the Presbytery." I'd like to share a lovely poem with you now...



How to Craft a Nativity Scene Take a cave crowded with sheep and oxen A trough bedded with straw, A snow-hushed winter's night; A brown-eyed girl of sixteen, And her husband of twenty; Myriad clusters of caroling angels Sparkling their song across the midnight sky Like silver and crystal bells sounding Peace; Ten or twelve shepherds, heads uplifted And staring in awe At the single, brightest star vou've ever seen Hovering over the hill; And God just become a baby. Then kneel. And hush... Don't make a sound.

What stands out in Fr. Joe's obituary is the number of transfers he had over the course of his religious life. His first assignment, by the way, was right here in New Smyrna Beach, at Sacred Heart Church when he was newly ordained in 1968. Then he went to another Sacred Heart in Griffen, Georgia, where he saw the parish community almost double in size during his tenure.

We know many a confrere upon receiving a call from the Provincial about a transfer to say, "Oh, Fr. Provincial, I'm settled in here - please look for someone else." I suspect that Fr. Joe was that "someone else" on many occasions. Fr. Joe said "yes," which is the essence of religious obedience - yes to God, yes to the Redemptorists, yes to the vows and the promise of perseverance.

If we believe the words of St. Alphonsus are true about receiving a beautiful crown that is prepared for everyone who lives in observance and dies in the Congregation, then we have a new saint in heaven. A saint who can empathize with us when we struggle. A saint who can aid us with his prayers of intercession and his example. If we believe that Paradise awaits us

Then kneel
And hush...
Don't make a sound.

The Master, our Lord Jesus Christ, has shown us the way. And no one comes to the Father except through him.

Homeless Family finds home at Sacred Heart

On behalf of St. Gerard Church, we extend our heartfelt thanks to Sacred Heart parishioners and priests. Through God's grace you have made us feel welcome in God's NSB house – Sacred Heart.

It began in March, when our world went on lock down. All our churches were closed. Desperate for spiritual guidance and nourishment, our church turned to the Internet to stay connected to many parishioners. The Eucharist was celebrated daily on TV. On Pentecost Sunday most churches including Sacred Heart Church were granted permission to open its doors for worship again, however, the doors of St. Gerard were to remain closed.
