



Valentine's Day Sweetheart Dinners. Thanks to all who supported this fundraiser!


# Knights of Columbus Council 4934 Recognize Family of the Month



# Message from President

Trish Degen—I would like to thank all our parishioners-young and old-that have helped to keep it possible to help our neighbors in need during 2020 and especially

with how the Covid affected everyone. The clients are calling in as before to ask the telephone teams for assistance. The baggers are making the bags to go out. The data entry team members are making sure that information is correct in the system. The pantry is well stocked by the food management team members that help bring in two thousand pounds of food from Second Harvest every week and all the donations of food that we receive from our parishioners at our doors at both churches. The home visitation teams make sure that our neighbor's in need get their groceries or help in a timely manner.

The changes that the covid has really caused is the decrease in numbers of new volunteers, numbers of our existing volunteers have decreased due to their own health issues that keep them home, and lastly is the way that we deliver the food to our neighbors. The teams go out with a bottle of hand sanitizer in each car and of course they have their masks. When they get to their destination, the team calls the neighbor and tells them that we are at their home and we will be leaving the bags at the door. We want to make sure someone is home so none of the food spoils and to tell them to wait until we are back in the car to get their bags.

SVdP wants our Vincentians to be safe and healthy. We used zoom to have meetings, social distanced, we were given masks from FEMA, we sanitize all work stations before working, and if anyone is not feeling well, they don't come in to volunteer.

For the year 2020, with all your help, we served food to 2459 families consisting of 6467 individuals, we helped pay utilitieslike gas, water, electric, etc.- for 202 families consisting of 531 individuals, we helped with transportation-like bus passes, gas, etc.-for 118 families consisting of 224 individuals, and miscellaneous items-like prescriptions, medical needs, propane, tents, sleeping bags, etc.- for 113 families consisting of 150 individuals. All of the above can't be done without your help however big or small with your time and gifts like knowledge, donations, and your personal stories and the extra service to our neighbors. All of this made possible with you. Thank you.
