Reflection

Do you recognize the glory and presence of the Lord Jesus in your life? God often reveals his glory to us in the unlikely of places - in a cold stable at Bethlehem, at a village wedding party in Cana, on a bloody cross at Golgatha, or on the road to Emmaus. In today's Gospel reading we see the first public sign and miracle which Jesus performed. The Lord Jesus brought great blessing and joy to a newly wed couple and their wedding party. First by his presence, and second by saving them from embarrassment when the wine ran out. Changing water into wine was a remarkable act of kindness; but giving the best to last was unnecessary and unheard of. In the Old Testament wine is seen as both a gift and blessing of God (Deuteronomy 7:13; Proverbs 3:10, Psalm 105:). That Jesus would miraculously produce 120 gallons of the best wine (many times more than needed) shows the superabundance of the blessings which he came to offer.

This miracle signifies the "new rich wine" of the Gospel and it points to the "wine of the new covenant" and the "bread of life" which Jesus provides for his disciples in the Lord's Supper or Eucharist. It also points to the Messianic banquet which Jesus will provide at the end of the age when he comes again in his glory. The miracles of Jesus demonstrate the power of God's love and mercy for his people. God's kindness knows no limits. And the ultimate expression of his love is revealed in the person of his Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. He became flesh for our sake, and he died for our redemption, and he rose that we, too, might be raised up and glorified with him.

Do you thirst for God and for the abundant life and blessings he offers to you?

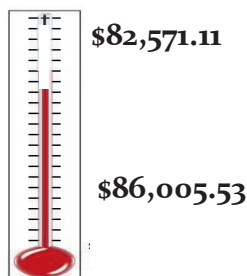

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners

How do you respond to the word "ordinary?" Does the idea of "ordinary" excite you? Probably not!

Just in case anyone is interested, this unexciting word "ordinary" comes from the Latin, suggesting something regular, something according to order. In the Catholic mass, the "ordinary" is the section of the liturgy that is fixed, unvarying, the same every Sunday. The adjective "ordinary" means customary, usual, normal, and even unexceptional. Are we excited about "ordinary" yet? Did you know that in the traditional church year, the Sunday after the Baptism of the Lord and the Sunday after Pentecost begins what is called "ORDINARY TIME?" Ordinary time is what one person calls "nonfestive time." And isn't it significant that this "ordinary time," this "nonfestive time" takes up about half a year of Sundays.

Is Jesus at work in us and in the church during "ordinary time?" Is it only through exciting times and festive seasons that we see God at work? You see, the discovery of God lies in the daily and the ordinary, not in the spectacular and the heroic. It has been said if we cannot find God in the routines of home and shop, then we will not find Him at all."



In closing, on January 21, 2022 the annual March for Life will take place once again in Washington, DC.

Tomorrow, Monday, January 17th we commemorate as a Nation a great Human Rights Leader, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who was assassinated in 1968 for defending the fundamental truth of the dignity of every human person.

For anyone who honestly examines the facts, the connection between the Annual March for Life and life of this special man, being held in the same week each year is crystal clear and belong perfectly together. As we honor the memory of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. may it help us to fulfill his unfulfilled dream - by defending the first and fundamental human right, the Right to Life. I close by sharing with you words he wrote, spoke, believed and lived, "Now is the time to make justice a reality to all of God's children". That includes our youngest neighbors in the womb. Defending them is the human rights, solidarity and equality cause of our age."

SACRED HEART SCHOOL

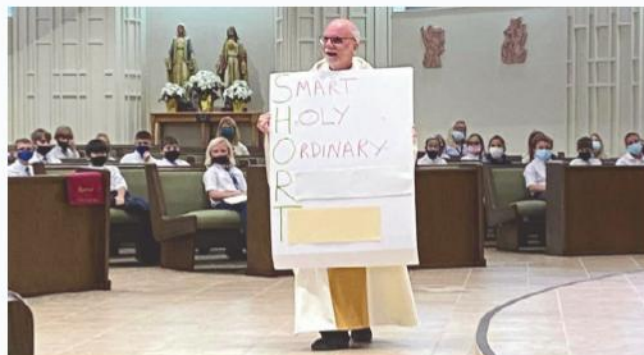
