

Reflection

Jesus came to give us the fire of his Spirit that we may radiate the joy and truth of the Gospel to a world in desperate need of God's light and truth. His word has power to change and transform our lives that we may be burning lights pointing others to Jesus Christ. Like John the Baptist, we too are called to give testimony to the light and truth of Jesus Christ. Do you want the Lord's power, grace, and love to burn brightly in your life? Ask him to fill you with his Holy Spirit.

John preached a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins (Luke 3:3). Why did Jesus, the Sinless One, submit himself to John's baptism? In this humble submission we see a foreshadowing of the "baptism" of his bloody death upon the cross. Jesus' baptism is the acceptance and the beginning of his mission as God's suffering Servant (Isaiah 53). He allowed himself to be numbered among sinners. Jesus submitted himself entirely to his Father's will. Out of love he consented to this baptism of death for the remission of our sins. Do you know the joy of trust and submission to God?

Lord Jesus, fill me with your Holy Spirit and with the fire of your love and goodness.

May I always find joy and delight in seeking to please you in doing your will just as you have delighted in the joy of pleasing your Father and doing his will.

Dear Parishioners

Well.... It's all over... Christmas, it came and went just like that! I truly hope each and every one of you had a good Christmas, filled with fun and excitement and good times with family and friends.

I guess before long – if we haven't already done it - it will be time to put all the Christmas decorations and things away until next year. The tree starts looking old and the lights don't seem to be so bright anymore after Christmas is over... it's a new year and we need to get on with that.

I am sure that most of you have a manger or several mangers with Jesus and Mary and Joseph? Isn't it nice to look at that and think about the Christmas Story and Jesus being born? But I guess it will be time to put Jesus away too, back in the boxes and back in the closet.

A Small Church Community (SCC) is a small group of adults who gather to reflect on their lives in the light of the Gospel and to share their Christian faith through prayer, friendship and service.



The early Christians gathered in small groups, most frequently in a home. That experience allowed a deep sharing of faith and life. Today, SCCs facilitate that deep sharing in the presence of trusted friends. Relationships are formed in which sharing, listening and genuine communication are nurtured. The sharing of faith and life leads to action on behalf of others.

Although each SCC is unique in its membership, style, and meeting format, every SCC is involved in the following activities:

- Mutual support and faith sharing
- Prayer and ritual
- •• On-going formation in Scripture and Tradition that enables tangible connections between faith and life.
- Outreach beyond the SCC
