## SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples wanting to be married at Sacred Heart Parish must be registered and practicing members of this parish. An appointment must be made with one of the parish priests at least six months in advance of the wedding. The Diocese of Orlando requires a marriage preparation program for all couples.

## FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Children who are seven years or older, who have been baptized Roman Catholic, and who have participated in at least one full year of Religious Education during the previous year may be eligible to prepare for the Sacraments of Eucharist.

If there is anyone at home who cannot get to Mass to celebrate the Sacraments because of illness or age, please call the Parish Office at 428-6426.



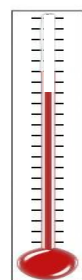

## Pastor's Corner



### Dear Parishioners

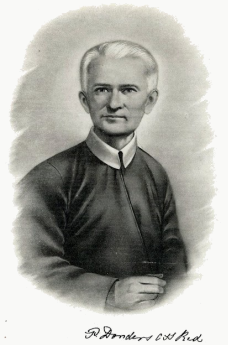
How do you respond to the word "ordinary?" Does the idea of "ordinary" excite you? Probably not!

Just in case anyone is interested, this unexciting word "ordinary" comes from the Latin, suggesting something regular, something according to order. In the Catholic mass, the "ordinary" is the section of the liturgy that is fixed, unvarying, the same every Sunday. The adjective "ordinary" means customary, usual, normal, and even unexceptional. Are we excited about "ordinary" yet? Did you know that in the traditional church year, the Sunday after the Baptism of the Lord and the Sunday after Pentecost begins what is called "ORDINARY TIME?" "Ordinary time" is thus the time after the journey to Bethlehem, the birth of the baby, the traveling of the wise men and bathing in the waters of the Jordan. And "Ordinary Time" continues until we begin these festivals again with the beginning of Lent and Easter next month. Ordinary time is what one person calls "non festive time." And isn't it significant that this "ordinary time," this "no festive time" takes up about half a year of Sundays. But doesn't that sound about right to us? As someone has put it, "life is so daily." And this dailiness of life can seem so mundane, so routine, so non-spectacular. We may pine for Christmas and Easter and Pentecost.

### BUT WHAT IS GOD UP TO DURING "ORDINARY TIME?"

Is Jesus at work in us and in the church during "ordinary time?" Is it only through exciting times and festive seasons that we see God at work? You see, the discovery of God lies in the daily and the ordinary, not in the spectacular and the heroic. It has been said that if we cannot find God in the routines of home and shop, then we will not find Him at all."

Today, January 14<sup>th</sup> we also celebrate the life of Blessed Peter Donders, C.Ss.R. A Redemptorist priest who worked for over 44 years with lepers. He was a quiet, steady form of God's love and God's power to all those he served. On May 23, 1982, Pope John Paul II declared Peter Donders "Blessed". This is the next to the last step before the Church can call him a "Saint".



Tomorrow, January 15<sup>th</sup> our country honors the memory of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. And on Friday, there will be the annual March for Life in Washington DC. Considering that, I close by sharing with you this poem:

### Twelve Weeks

My eyelids closed, I curl my toes,  
I feel...Her hand press her stomach.  
I wonder if, when at last she knows...  
Will she finally think of me? Or of what I will be,  
If given the choice? There are some things that we cannot see,  
Like organs now formed inside of me,
