

#### **Dear Parishioners**

A story is told of a man named Tony. Tony made a million dollars by the time he was 26 years old and a second million within two more years. By the time he was 30, Tony had more money than he could reasonably keep track of. One night Tony had a dream. He was in a courtroom on trial sitting with his defense attorney, whom he knew very well. The judge was a hazy figure he could not really see. At the opposite table sat a single woman, his own wife. She looked deep in thought. Suddenly, Tony was called to testify, and his wife coldly took up her position as his opposition and began to ask him questions.

"What have you done for your child?" she asked. "You know," Tony began, "that I have given her everything. We have a beautiful house, a swimming pool, two dogs, two new cars, all kinds of clothes and good food to eat. We pay the best doctors and dentists and are

sending her to the best school in town." Tony looked around and, for the first time, the face of the judge was clear enough to see. It was his own daughter dressed in her First Communion outfit, white dress and matching veil. Suddenly he awoke. Tony knew there was something he had not given to his little girl or to his wife. He had given them money but not himself, his time, his tenderness. He had never been a friend to his family. Now that would change.

During this month of May as we honor our Blessed Mother, we also celebrate the gift of Eucharist. Next weekend we will celebrate First Communion. I think it is a powerful reminder to all of us that God does more than just give us things. God spends time with us and wants to share our lives and be our friend. God gives us the gift of His mother to be our mother! He also gives us His Son Jesus in Holy Communion. Each and every rosary we pray and each and every communion we receive is a yet another chance to spend time with and grow closer in our relationship with our Lord.
