

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners

It's always easy to give in to rationalization, especially one that says that "what little talent I have will never be missed." But just think for a moment. If each note of music were to say "one note doesn't make a symphony," there would be no symphony; if each word were to say, "one word doesn't make a book," there would be no book; if each brick were to say, "one brick doesn't make a wall," there would be no house; if each of us were to say, "one act of love can't help humankind," there would never be justice and peace on earth.



Our faith calls us to work for justice; to serve those in need; to pursue peace; and to defend the life, dignity, and rights of all people, especially the unborn. This is the challenge of the prophets, the call of Jesus, and the living tradition of our Church. Across this country and around the world, Christianity's social teachings constitute a story of remarkable compassion, courage, and creativity. Yet in United States elections, only a small percentage of people eligible to vote turn out — ironically, when people in other parts of the world are struggling to participate in public life.

A story is told of a Lutheran Pastor who wrote a valuable lesson about his experience with the Nazis: "In Germany they first came for the Communists, and I didn't speak up because I wasn't a Communist. Then they came for the Jews, and I didn't speak out because I wasn't a Jew. Then they came for the trade unionists, and I didn't speak out because I wasn't a trade unionist. Then they came for the Catholics, and I didn't speak out because I am a Protestant. And then they came for me — but by that time there was no one left to speak."

As we approach Election Day, the prominent question for you and me is: Are you ready to vote? These days it seems as if that were a perpetual question. One campaign is hardly over before the next one begins. The political commercials on television are endless: the charges and the countercharges, one side "pointing with pride," the other "viewing with alarm." Someone once said, "Politics is the art of looking for trouble, finding it everywhere, diagnosing it wrongly, and applying unsuitable remedies." Sounds like a perfect description of what we get with all these thirty-second paid political announcements. As wearying as all that may be, elections are important in a free society. Jesus told us to "Render unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's," and one of the things that belongs to Caesar in our day is that vote, YOUR vote.

I remember reading about the former President Calvin Coolidge, who was a man of very few words. His nickname, as you know, was "Silent Cal." Before he became the President of the United States, one of the offices he ran for and was elected to, was as mayor of Northampton, Massachusetts. It was a relatively close race and he won by 190 votes. The following day he was walking down the street, and a friend came up to him who was a Democrat (Coolidge was a Republican) and said, "Calvin, I read in the paper this morning where you were elected the mayor, but I just wanted you to know I didn't vote for you." Coolidge just looked at him and said, "Well somebody did."

Well God voted for me, and God has voted for you to be a part of His work, and to labor in His vineyard. But just as the people who voted for Calvin Coolidge didn't have to vote for him, neither did God have to choose you or me. That's why we must never forget that to be involved in the work of God is not a duty or a chore, it is a privilege. If you have not done so already, then please be sure to vote.


