



#### FRIDAYS DURING LENT - 7:00PM AT SACRED HEART

#### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Parents & Godparents are required to attend a Sacramental Preparation Class. Please call the Parish Office at 428-6426 to register.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples wanting to be married at Sacred Heart Parish must be registered and practicing members of this parish. An appointment must be made with one of the parish priests at least six months in advance of the wedding. The Diocese of Orlando requires a marriage preparation program for all couples.

#### FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Children who are seven years or older, who have been baptized Roman Catholic, and who have participated in at least one full year of religious education during the previous year may be eligible to prepare for the Sacraments of Eucharist.

#### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

At Sacred Heart Church the Sacrament of Reconciliation is available every Saturday from 3:00pm to 3:45pm or by appointment. Please call the Parish Office at 428-6426.

## Pastor's Corner



#### **Dear Parishioners**

A pastor tells this Ash Wednesday story which I think tells us all about the Ashes of this coming Wednesday.

"Grant" – was a quiet but faithful member of the Church who was always there. He was not a tall man, but he was an imposing person. Grant had a larger than average totally bald head, it was broad and well shaped so as to be the envy of all men. Little did the pastor know that it would be Grant who would help him get a more satisfying perspective on Lent.

This seemed the perfect time to try out the Lenten services in a book the pastor was reading, "From Ashes to Fire." He followed the suggestions in the book. First the ushers passed out slips of paper on which the congregation was invited to write down some past sin or some harmful habit that they would like to be forgiven for or delivered from. Then these were collected and burned ceremoniously in a metal basket. Then these were mixed with darker ashes burned from palm branches - and now for his first experience at the imposition of ashes. As the people knelt across the altar, each worshiper received a cross marked on His or her brow. However, he soon knew he was in trouble. Many women were wearing a flip hairstyle with their hair pulled across their forehead, leaving no space for the mark. As the pastor struggled to find a place, sometimes the ladies would lift their hair and make room to put the mark on the forehead. But then it might partially disappear when the hair was released. Even the men had extra long hair. This was not going as he had expected. He was sweating profusely. Then, moving to the middle of the last group, the pastor saw Grant and that magnificent large, bald head - an oasis in the desert - a giant canvas on which to portray the fullness of God's love and forgiveness. His eyes lit up. Happiness welled up in his soul. It was a struggle not to laugh out loud with joy, and from the stark contrast to the stingy spaces he had been dealing with. After standing for a moment gazing down at the greatest opportunity any one could ever dream of for the imposition of ashes, it became clear that he was free to draw as large as he wished. He was not even limited to the forehead - his whole head was an inviting space. With great abandon, the cross was drawn across that vast expanse - manifold times larger than any that had gone before. Then, triumphantly and with great joy, the pastor turned to the congregation and pointed to the cross he had just drawn. They celebrated with me and broke out in applause.

Ash Wednesday is the day that we must acknowledge that we do need a good bath. We need the rains of God's grace, of his forgiveness to wash over us, so that we can stand in the redeeming light and hope of Easter.

In light of this, I do not want to forget this year of Jubilee in the Church!

Pope Francis officially declared 2025 a Jubilee Year for the Church in May 2024, with a papal document titled "Spes Non Confudit," which means "Hope Does Not Disappoint." The year-long celebration itself carries the theme: **"Pilgrims of Hope."** The Jubilee Year began with the opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve.

"During the Holy Year, we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind." A jubilee is a special holy year of grace, forgiveness, reconciliation and pilgrimage in the Church. What better time to renew this call to forgiveness, reconciliation, and pilgrimage than Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent! The Jubilee Year 2025 will end with the closing of the Holy Doors at St Peter's Basilica in January 2026 on the feast of the Epiphany.

For all of us, may the Jubilee be an opportunity to be renewed in hope.


