

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners

One of the questions that always seems to arise during the season of Lent concerns Fast and Abstinence. So, to help you in this, I share the following for any clarification needed.

Fasting

Catholics ages 18–59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting means eating one full meal and two smaller meals that don't add up to a full meal.

Snacking between meals is not allowed.

Abstinence

Catholics ages 14 and older are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent.

Abstinence means not eating meat or poultry.

Exceptions

People who are sick, diabetic, pregnant, or nursing are not required to fast or abstain.


People with other exceptional circumstances may also be exempt.

Purpose

Fasting and abstinence are ways to prepare for Easter and to honor Jesus' suffering and death. They are also ways to practice self-denial, grow spiritually, and strengthen one's resolve to move away from sin. Also remember: Prayer and almsgiving are also important parts of Lent.

While Lent is a time of fasting, it can also be so much more than that. Lent can also be a season of feasting. We can use Lent to fast from certain things and to feast on others. It is a season in which we can:

- Fast from judging others; feast on the Christ dwelling in them.
- Fast from emphasis on differences; feast on the unity of life.
- Fast from apparent darkness; feast on the reality of light.
- Fast from thoughts of illness; feast on the healing power of God.
- Fast from words that pollute; feast on phrases that purify.
- Fast from discontent; feast on gratitude.
- Fast from anger; feast on patience.
- Fast from pessimism; feast on optimism.
- Fast from worry; feast on divine order.
- Fast from complaining; feast on appreciation.
- Fast from negatives; feast on affirmatives.
- Fast from unrelenting pressures; feast on unceasing prayer.
- Fast from hostility; feast on non-resistance.
- Fast from bitterness; feast on forgiveness.
- Fast from self-concern; feast on compassion for others.
- Fast from personal anxiety; feast on eternal truth.
- Fast from discouragements; feast on hope.
- Fast from facts that depress; feast on verities that uplift.
- Fast from lethargy; feast on enthusiasm.
- Fast from thoughts that weaken; feast on promises that inspire.
- Fast from shadows of sorrow; feast on the sunlight of serenity.
- Fast from idle gossip; feast on purposeful silence.
- Fast from problems that overwhelm; feast on prayer that strengthens.




