

Peace to you and greetings in Christ, Our Most Holy Redeemer!

I am writing to share with you some information about a significant process of discernment that we Redemptorists have engaged in regarding our apostolic commitments. The reality of our aging, coupled with a significant decline in vocations to religious life and priesthood, is one of several factors that have brought us to the difficult, yet honest realization that we simply cannot continue to staff and serve all the pastoral commitments that we currently have in our care. Our awareness of our current reality of fewer Redemptorists has called us to engage in a formal process by which we will discern and decide which ministry commitments we are being called to continue to staff and which ones we will have to entrust to others so that the pastoral care and service we have rendered for many years may continue. In the midst of the challenges before us, we embrace this process as a community of faith with abiding trust in the love of God our Creator, the saving love of Christ our Redeemer, and the inspiring love of the Holy Spirit. As God's people, holy and beloved, we trust that God's goodness will lead us into our future with courage and strength.

The General Council of our Redemptorist Congregation has long encouraged the individual Provinces of Redemptorists throughout the world to engage in a process of review, discernment, and decision-making. In response, the January 2025 Second Session of the 18th Provincial Chapter of our Baltimore Province overwhelmingly approved the following directive: "That the 18th Provincial Chapter of the Baltimore Province directs the Extraordinary Provincial Council (EPC) to continue the province pastoral planning process with a view to making decisions by June 2025 about maintaining, changing, and/or drawing to completion current apostolic commitments. These decisions would be implemented no later than June 2026."

The stark clarity of the Chapter's Directive and its timeframe come from an honest review of our current Redemptorist reality. Our Province currently has 104 members, 45 of whom are aged 75 and above this year, 26 of whom are age 70 and above, leaving 33 members of our community between 69 and 29 years of age. Our current level of ministry commitments numbers 17 parishes and 1 Retreat Center, along with internal ministries of Province Administration and caring for our elderly and infirm confreres. For many years and indeed unto this present moment, we have been incredibly blessed by the zeal of many senior confreres who have continued to serve in ministry well into their elder years. Notwithstanding their generosity and dedication to ministry, we believe that the present reality summons us to make changes for the good of both our Redemptorist community and for the good of the People of God. Be assured that we are not discerning and deciding on changes for lack of zeal or for lack of hope in our future. On the contrary, we trust that we are being called to this discernment to galvanize renewed energy, zeal, and hope for our mission and charism.

In responding to the directive of the Provincial Chapter, the Provincial Council is faithful to its obligation and responsibility to follow through and implement such decisions through its ministry of leadership. While previous Provincial Councils have made changes in our commitments, including bringing some of our ministries to closure, the process of making such difficult choices is an arduous and challenging one. With the realization that our current situation is not a sustainable one, and being cognizant of the emotional intensity and challenges of reaching painful, yet necessary decisions, we have engaged a church management professional to help us proceed with our discernment process with as much objectivity and integrity as possible. The facilitation has helped us to remain true to our commitment and responsibility to make these difficult decisions.

"WITH HIM IS PLENTIFUL REDEMPTION"

Over these past months the whole community has been in dialogue and prayerful reflection on establishing criteria for the review of our ministries and for gathering relevant information to help the Provincial Council arrive at decisions regarding changes in light of our missionary and apostolic priorities. No decisions have yet been made, but they will be forthcoming. The Provincial Council intends to make decisions after careful dialogue and prayerful discernment in the coming months and to communicate these decisions by May 5, 2025.

We Redemptorists are clear that prudence, stewardship, and the good of our community and the People of God make these decisions necessary at this time. We also recognize the challenges, difficulties, and stressors that readily accompany such decisions for all who are impacted by them. This is especially the case when these decisions involve saying farewell to cherished ministries and beloved faith communities that have blessed us and that we have served so well and for so long with deep joy and great gladness. For these reasons, I earnestly ask for your prayers for the light and guidance of the Holy Spirit upon all of us - the Redemptorist Provincial Council, the Redemptorist Community, and all the people we serve in our beloved communities of ministry – during this time of transition.

I write this letter to every one of our Redemptorist family in the spirit of transparency and with gratitude to God for the grace and light of the Holy Spirit within and among us. These times summon all of us to call upon our shared faith in God's abundantly providential love to guide us through whatever changes are to come. May we hold one another in prayer and trust in God's promise to lead us to fullness of life through Christ, Our Redeemer, as we move forward in faith, with hope, and in love.


KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS NEWS




