

# Diocesan Special Collection May 25, 2025

## Archdiocese of the Military Services, USA

The AMS provides pastoral care to Catholic men and women serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or who work for the federal government beyond U.S. borders - including those from our own parish and diocese.

#### **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:**

Parents & Godparents are required to attend a Sacramental Preparation Class. Please call the Parish Office at 428-6426 to register.

#### **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:**

Couples wanting to be married at Sacred Heart Parish must be registered and practicing members of this parish. An appointment must be made with one of the parish priests at least six months in advance of the wedding. The Diocese of Orlando requires a marriage preparation program for all couples.

#### FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Children who are seven years or older, who have been baptized Roman Catholic, and who have participated in at least one full year of Religious Education during the previous year may be eligible to prepare for the Sacraments of Eucharist.

#### **SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:**

At Sacred Heart Church the Sacrament of Reconciliation is available Saturday afternoon from 3:00pm to 3:45pm or by appointment-428-6426.

#### **ANOINTING of the SICK:**

If you have a loved one who would like to receive the Anointing of the Sick please call the Parish Office, 428-6426.

#### **COMMUNION for Shut-Ins:**

Call the Parish Office- 428-6426 to arrange a Friday visit.

#### MINISTRY to the SICK and Homebound:

If there is anyone at home who cannot get to Mass to celebrate the Sacraments because of illness or age, please call the Parish Office, 428-6426



# Pastor's Corner



#### Dear Parishioners

It has been said that "Sunny days wouldn't be so beautiful if we didn't have cloudy ones." As we continue this month of May in this Easter season, the month we honor our Blessed Mother, we remember her "Yes" to God, but for a moment let us consider her NO. I think we can better appreciate her "yes" to God if we consider when she said "no." Let's look at 10 of them:

- 1. She said no to every excuse or condition that she might have placed before God's will. In realizing that she was the one chosen to be the Mother of God, she didn't demand anything or make any excuses. She simply accepted.
- 2. **She said no to vanity.** The young women of her time could have dreamed of being the mother of the Messiah. When she was chosen, Mary didn't lose her bearings or believe herself somehow above everyone else. She recognized herself as the simple servant of the Lord.
- 3. **She said no to gossip.** She didn't dash off to tell the world about her mission and her baby. In fact she didn't even tell Joseph ... not even to protect herself.
- 4. **She said no to self-centeredness.** As Gabriel left, she didn't settle down to spoil herself and have some rest. On the contrary, when the angel told her about Elizabeth, she got straight to work, thinking about others even in her own state.
- 5. She said no to special privileges. When she heard about the census, she could have asked God for some angelic assistance. And asked Him again when they had to flee to Egypt. And again when Jesus was lost in the Temple. But she never expected God to send angels or extraordinary graces to help her.
- 6. **She said no to dwelling on the "what ifs."** When she had to give birth in a situation very different than what she and Joseph would have wanted, she didn't spend her time thinking about what could have been. She adapted to what God permitted and made the best of it.
- 7. **She said no to living in a bubble.** She could have shut herself off in a little world with Joseph and her divine Son, to relish the delights of living with such company. Instead, from the beginning, she gave her Child to others to the shepherds, to the Magi, and later on, to the world entire.
- 8. **She said no to the temptation to resist God's plans.** When Simon told Mary of the sword that would pierce her heart, she had a vision of the Passion. She saw the cross awaiting Jesus. She could have begun already then to beg God for a change of plans, but instead, she accepted.
- 9. **She said no to the rejection she must have felt when presented with us as her children.** From the cross, her Son entrusted her to the beloved disciple, and in doing so, He entrusted her to all of us. How difficult it must have been to accept this maternity to be the mother of all of us whose sins caused the death of her Beloved. But again, she said yes, and not with hesitation or mere resignation. What love!
- **10. She said and says no to any lapse in loving us and praying for us.** Mary didn't nurse resentment at the disciples who abandoned Jesus on the cross. After the Ascension, she dedicated herself to prayer with and for them. When she was assumed into heaven, she continued her role as our mother. She is concerned for our needs and our difficulties and spends her eternity praying for us. She lives in the Heavenly Kingdom, attentive to the earthly one, still and forever the best of mothers.

Let us ask Our Lady to help us to imitate her in these times she said "no" and let us add three "nevers": Let us resolve never to forget her, never to stop loving her, and never to fail to turn to her in our needs.


