Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners

A.J. Gordon was the great Baptist pastor of the Clarendon Church in Boston, Massachusetts. One day he met a young boy in front of the sanctuary carrying a rusty cage in which several birds fluttered nervously. Gordon inquired, "Son, where did you get those birds?" The boy replied, "I trapped them out in the field." "What are you going to do with them?" "I'm going to play with them, and then I guess I'll just feed them to an old cat we have at home." When Gordon offered to buy them, the lad exclaimed, "Mister, you don't want them, they're just little old wild birds and can't sing very well." Gordon replied, "I'll give you \$2 for the cage and the birds." "Okay, it's a deal, but you're making a bad bargain." The exchange was made, and the boy went away whistling, happy with his shiny coins. Gordon walked around to the back of the church property, opened the door of the small wire coop, and let the struggling creatures soar into the blue. The next Sunday he took the empty cage into the pulpit and used it to illustrate his sermon about Christ's coming to seek and to save the lost -- paying for them with His own precious blood. "That boy told me the birds were not songsters," said Gordon, "but when I released them and they winged their way heavenward, it seemed to me they were singing, 'Redeemed, redeemed, redeemed!"



On this third Sunday of July, we Redemptorists celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Redeemer. Please remember to pray for an increase of Redemptorist vocations! All Redemptorists have four letters after their names – C.Ss.R. This stands for *Congregatio Sanctissimi Redemptoris*. This is the official Latin title given to our Religious Order. It can be translated into English as "Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer," more commonly called "Redemptorists." On our coat of arms seen in the picture on the right, is written: **Copiosa Apud Eum Redemptio = With Him There Is Plentiful Redemption**. According to our rule, we are "to strive to imitate the virtues and examples of Jesus <u>Christ</u>, Our <u>Redeemer</u>, consecrating themselves especially to the preaching of the word of God to the poor." St. Alphonsus founded the Redemptorists in the hills of Naples, Italy in a small village called Scala. It was to the poor shepherds and goat herders that St. Alphonsus preached. They didn't want to know how to tend their flocks or fields; they wanted to know that God loved them! With that, the mission and purpose of the

Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer took root. We Redemptorists strive to live and proclaim the story of the Cross and of Jesus Christ who loves us and has saved us as our Redeemer. "From his fullness we have all received, grace in place of grace." (John 1:16) And in the beautiful words of the Easter Exultet proclamation, "What good would life have been to us, had Christ not come as our Redeemer?"

Gregory of Nazianzus was the 4th-century Archbishop of Constantinople. That's over 1,600 years ago. I would like to close with this wonderful ironic description he wrote of Jesus:

He began His ministry by being hungry, yet He is the Bread of Life.

Jesus ended His earthly ministry by being thirsty, yet He is the Living Water. Jesus was weary, yet He is our rest.

Jesus paid tribute, yet He is the King.

Jesus was accused of having a demon, yet He cast out demons.

Jesus wept, yet He wipes away our tears.

Jesus was sold for thirty pieces of silver, yet He **redeemed** the world. Jesus was brought as a lamb to the slaughter, yet He is the Good Shepherd. Jesus died, yet by His death He destroyed the power of death.

Happy Feast of the Most Holy Redeemer!


