

Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners

For every good deed that we do, there is surely going to be glorious reward. This week, like last week, we celebrate a woman whose fear of God brought her great reward; a woman who was not only pure in body, but pure in heart as well when God decided to make her his own mother; a woman whose firm "YES" to God changed the course of human history.

Three days ago, the Church celebrated the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary into heaven. In the course of these days, the Church meditates deeper on the mystery of the Assumption. She concludes the reflection with the celebration of the Queenship of Mary, celebrated on Friday of this week.

This special feast happens to be the last of the five glorious mysteries. On Easter Sunday, we celebrated the first, which is the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead, then we celebrated his Ascension into heaven about forty days later. On Pentecost day, we celebrated the third glorious mystery which is the Descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. On the 15th of August, we celebrated the fourth, which is the Assumption of Mary into heaven and today, we complete the glorious mysteries with the celebration of the coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven.

Each of these glorious mysteries are episodes in the history of Christianity which deserves our full attention and meditation. They point to one fact: THAT AFTER THE PAIN OF THE CROSS, THERE IS SOMETHING BEAUTIFUL AHEAD. As St. Paul would say: "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him."

The Queenship of Mary is a natural follow-up of her glorious Assumption into heaven; her final reward, so to say, and the fulfilment of the words of Angel Gabriel at the Annunciation. In short, it could be said that God assumed Mary into heaven to share the victory of Christ and to reign with Him in glory as Queen of Heaven. In celebrating the Queenship of Mary, we are also reminded that we are the Chosen people of God and we are also His royal children. So as God's Chosen and royal people, all that we do and say must be geared towards giving glory to God. Mary showed us how to do that when she responded to God's call by accepting God's will. In doing so, Mary gave us the concrete example of obedience in the form of servanthood. We are not just the Chosen and royal people of God. We are also the Chosen and royal servants of Christ the King.

So the proclamation and celebration of Mary's Queenship, in essence, points to the Kingship of Christ. If Jesus Christ is a king whose reign shall last forever, it follows that Mary his mother is a Queen. Her Queenship is a share in the Kingship of Jesus. Like Mary, we all are somehow going to be partakers of the glory of Jesus. With Mary as our queen, let us offer ourselves in service to the Church, so that in all that we do and say, God will be glorified and exalted.
