

Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners

This weekend, the Church closes the liturgical year with the celebration of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. Each time we celebrate this feast, I am reminded of a story by Mark Twain called *The Prince and the Pauper*.

It is the story of two boys who lived in England. Not only were they good friends, they looked so much alike that they could be taken for identical twins. One of the boys was Edward, the Prince of Wales; the other was Tom Canty, a pauper, a poor boy.

One day, for some fun, they decided to switch places. They changed clothes. Edward put on the rags of a poor boy and wandered through the slums of London, living among beggars and the underprivileged. As a result of his experience he

learned firsthand what it meant to be poor, to be treated badly, and to be oppressed unfairly by those in authority. The prince eventually became king and became a kind and just ruler; one of the most merciful and best loved kings ever to reign on the throne of England.

The story of the Prince and the Pauper is not unlike the story of Jesus Christ and each one of us. Christ is a Prince, the true Son of God. In a very real way Jesus Christ switched places with us who are poor. He clothed Himself in our poor flesh. Jesus exchanged the royal robes of His divinity for the rags of our humanity. In doing so, Jesus Christ made each one of us a prince by clothing us in the robes of His grace, even sharing His own divine life with us.

Like the prince in Mark Twain's story, Jesus learned firsthand what it is like to live among the poor and the downtrodden. Unlike the prince in the story however, Jesus did something infinitely more. He died at the hands of His own subjects, rose from the dead and now reigns as king of Heaven and Earth.

As God, Jesus knew the sufferings of our human condition. By becoming man God actually suffered and experienced what we must endure.

Each time we celebrate Eucharist, we serve and worship Christ our King. Even more, we receive the King of Kings. We receive Jesus Christ into our very hearts. Let us pray that as we do so, our hearts may be free, ready and open. That our hearts may be His throne so He may rein over the kingdom and palace our lives forever.

Next week begins a "new year" in the Church, the season of Advent! We will make available once again the little blue Advent books for each family. I hope this small book will help on your spiritual journey through Advent and Christmas.



Therefore, Advent is, so to speak, an intense training that directs us decisively toward him who already came, who will come, and who comes continuously." - St. John Paul I
