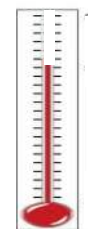

Dear Parishioners

The 2026 theme, “**Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community**,” celebrates the unique role these institutions play in the Church’s mission. By focusing on forming saints and educating the “whole person”—body, mind, and spirit—Catholic schools provide a foundation where academic excellence and spiritual growth are inseparable.

Central to this mission is the understanding that faith is the ultimate binding element.

This unity is built on several key pillars:

Christ as the Foundation: Every aspect of the school community is rooted in a shared Christian vision, ensuring that education is an act of faith.

The Family Partnership: Recognizing parents as the primary educators, schools extend their community beyond the classroom to embrace and support the family unit.

A Living Faith: Teachers, staff, and students work together to integrate gospel values into daily life, bridging the gap between culture and creed.

Service and Tradition: The community is nourished by scripture and the sacraments, moving beyond the physical building to serve God and the wider human family.

Ultimately, the CSW logo and theme remind us that a Catholic school is not just an institution, but a vibrant community of people dedicated to shining the light of Christ in the world.

The origin of Catholic schools can best illustrate their enduring mission. At the turn of the 20th century, when Catholics began to arrive in large numbers to this country as immigrants, often their children were not welcomed in the public schools, in large part because of their Catholic faith. In some states, there was active persecution of Catholics. In other places, there was widespread discrimination that made effective education nearly impossible. The response of bishops and local Catholic leaders was not to run away from the problem. Rather, in order to make sure that their children could build a better life than they enjoyed and to ensure that they would understand and live their Catholic faith, tens of thousands of Catholic schools were built throughout the country. At their height, in the mid-1960’s, there were nearly 5.5 million children in Catholic schools in this country.

Our own Redemptorist, St. John Neumann, built over 50 schools in Philadelphia alone.

Catholic schools remain dedicated to forming young people in the faith through a superior, holistic education. By unlocking each student's unique gifts and talents, we ensure they receive the highest quality instruction while growing spiritually and intellectually.

Children entrusted to our care are also invited to encounter the love of Christ in their midst each day, so that they may come to know, love and serve Him. All children of every faith are welcomed and respected in our schools - to share in the gift of Catholic education.

As we celebrate Catholic Schools Week, let me express my appreciation to our school principal, Mrs. Elizabeth LeBreche, administrators, teachers, staff, alumni, Redemptorists past and present, who ministered to Sacred Heart School. It is these living witnesses who by their instruction, and most especially their example, create the school communities that pass on our faith. I am most grateful for their commitment to our schools and their living witness to our faith.

Most especially, I want to thank YOU, our parents, and parishioners. Thank you for choosing Sacred Heart School, thank you for your continued support, generosity, and prayers for our school. I hope you will find an opportunity during this week to express your appreciation also. What is Ordinary Time?

Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ.

Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. (www.USCCB.org)

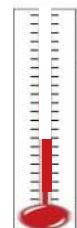
